Mulligan's Marauders get together Friday night and travel to Sackville N.B. to take on Mt. Allison. The stats say it should be a blowout and hopefully it will be.

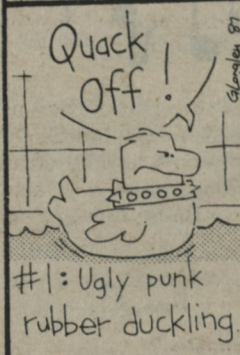

Main Building to Close

UPEI PRESIDENT Elliot has circulated a letter to occupants of Main building informing them that the entire building must be emptied by May of this year.

The letter stated that planned renovations to Main can begin now that the provincial government has announced a five-year contribution of \$1 million for the project. Plans for Main building have not been finalized as yet but suggestions put forth under the university

fund-raising campaign included a 25 per cent increase in floor space, a student lounge, and (thankfully) an elevator for the 124-year old former dormitory.

Relocation of some of Main's occupants has already begun with the move of the Student Services office from the 1st floor to the Robertson Library building. Plans call for renovations to be completed "in late summer 1988."

Calgary Students Ousted for Olympics

CALGARY (CUP) — The bad news for residents of the University of Calgary student housing is they will be evicted to make room for the 1988 Winter Olympics. The good news is they will compensation: tickets to the 1988 Winter Olympics.

About 900 students must leave their residences in January to mid March of 1988 when the residences are transformed into the olympic village.

Mike Adam of U of C Ancillary Services said the alumni association and Student Union

are working on a plan to billet students at private residences of alumni.

The tickets will be for all events, although they will not have preferential status.

The residence compensation

plan is not related to the Students' Union planned ticket order.

The SU will give its tickets to students who could not meet the Sept. 30 deadline for ticket orders.
