



### NAVY GETS FIRST ANTI-SUB PLANE

The first of the new CS2F-1 anti-submarine aircraft pictured here in flight, was turned over to the navy at a ceremony in Toronto Friday. The carrier-borne plane is armed with rockets and torpedoes, effective against either surfaced or submerged targets. The aircraft has a range of 1,000 miles with a maximum speed of 300 miles an hour. The twin-engine, propeller-driven craft cost about \$800,000 each and are being built by deHavilland Aircraft of Canada at Toronto.

### N. S. Progressive Conservatives Issue Platform For Election

HALIFAX (CP)—The Progressive Conservative party Friday night put up its platform for the Oct. 30 provincial election with promises of a new industrial development program, new education studies, highway construction, broadened health and welfare services and a series of other changes.

"Nova Scotia has lost its economic leadership, among the Atlantic provinces," says the manifesto. If elected, a PC government will sponsor a Nova Scotia industrial development organization and any person, group, company or municipality can subscribe shares. The government would match each subscription dollar aiming toward a minimum capital of \$10,000,000. New development research programs would be established and regional co-operation "will be free of narrow sectionalism and political partisanship."

**DEAL WITH EDUCATION**  
In education, teachers would be encouraged into the profession by government scholarships, the provincial normal college would be expanded and "we will re-examine the problems of our present system of education and educational finance."

All roads ready or near-ready for paving would be hard-surfaced "without delay." Secondary roads would be improved, old bridges replaced, tolls on ear ferries would be removed.

In public administration, the party says it would repeal the act which gives cabinet ministers a pension for length of service, but ministers now eligible would not be affected. An auditor-general would be appointed and would be responsible only to the legislature. Under health and welfare, the party promises enlarged hospital facilities, help in housing programs, a prison farm, and a program for the treatment of alcoholics.

### No Earth Satellites Besides The Moon

WASHINGTON (AP)—The army said Friday that three years of searching have failed to locate any earth satellites besides the moon.

An army spokesman said the most recent reports from Astronomer Clyde Tombaugh on studies started in 1953 were that no unusual sightings had been made.

Army ordnance ordered the study to explore the possibility that small unseen satellites might be circling the earth 200 or more miles out in space. Such miniature moons could be potential hazards to space flight.

### Work Of Young Artists Hung

LONDON (CP)—Work of nine young artists of several different nationalities is being shown at an art gallery in Mayfair. The exhibition was organized by a British art expert, Dudley Toth, who visits France each year in quest of paintings by talented young artists.

One work is by the sensational French painter Buffet, whose paintings have been drawing high prices. There are several paintings by Jean-Paul Riopelle of Montreal, who is the only abstract painter to be shown.

Riopelle employs a technique known as "Spotism." He uses a palette knife, rather than a brush and moulds the paint into ridges. Riopelle is in his early 30s.

### Three Children In N. B. Die In Fire

EDMUNDSTON, N. B. (CP)—Three children of Mr. and Mrs. Bernard Bryan were burned to death Friday when fire swept their home at Flemming Settlement, three miles from St. Leonard, N.B.

The parents and their other 10 children managed to escape, said reports reaching here. The fire broke out about 8:30 a.m. and is believed to have been caused by an overheated stove. Firemen from St. Leonard and Van Buren, Maine, were called to the fire.

The dead are a 27-day-old infant, Marie-Francoise-Verna; one-year-old Jean-Francois and two-year-old Marie-Francoise.

Coroner Dr. Charles St. Pierre of St. Leonard said an inquest will be held.

### Some Provinces Will Sign New Taxation Agreements

OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister St. Laurent said Thursday that some provinces had indicated they will sign new tax rental agreements with the federal government next year.

But he did not want to name them, he told reporters following a two-hour cabinet meeting. He would rather the provinces make their own announcements.

The fact they had not already done so indicated they "might want to change their minds." He told a press conference Sept. 28 that New Brunswick had already indicated it wanted a rental pact.

He said also Thursday that he wired Premier Flemming of New Brunswick that he would be prepared to meet with him early next month to consider the premier's proposals for asking credit in the Atlantic provinces.

#### MORE DISCUSSION

Mr. Fleming had stated earlier that the federal administration's "tight-money" policy aimed

at fighting inflation by restricting credit was hampering Maritime expansion and that this policy should be eased in the Atlantic area.

Mr. St. Laurent said he told Mr. Fleming that he could not see him this month because of prior engagements but that he could confer with him early next month. Mr. Fleming had replied thanking him for the wire and saying he was writing the prime minister further.

The prime minister announced the appointment of Victor Pagar, Montreal lawyer, to the Montreal Superior Court.

He said a number of decisions were made which would lead to future announcements.

Current tax rental agreements with the provinces expire next March 31. Under the new federal formula, provinces can exercise their constitutional rights of levying and collecting their direct taxes, have the central government collect them for a fee or continue to rent the fields to Ottawa.

The formula provides that tax-

payers will be allowed to deduct up to 10 per cent of the federal personal income tax, nine per cent of corporation income and 50 per cent of succession duties to cover provincial levies in these fields.

### Would Share Surplus Wheat

WINNIPEG (CP)—A leader of the United Church of Canada said Friday some of Canada's surplus wheat should be given away. Dr. J. R. Mutchmor of Toronto, secretary of the church's board of evangelism and social service, in an address to United College theological students, said:

"We must share our abundance with poorer people. Our 1,000,000, 000-bushel wheat store is too big for use and sale. Some of it must be given away. Likewise we must share our progress and achievement in the thermonuclear field. We must help provide atomic reactors to power-starved areas of the world."

#### VOLCANO ERUPTS

TOKYO (Reuters)—A violent volcanic eruption by Mount Sakurajima tossed tons of red-hot lava and ashes high into the sky over southern Japan Saturday. It is exactly a year since the last eruption which came after the mountain had been inactive for 41 years.

### Post Christmas Mail Early

OTTAWA (CP)—Army headquarters Friday advised persons corresponding with soldiers overseas: Post that Christmas mail early.

Closing dates for Christmas mail for soldiers abroad: Japan and Korea—surface mail must reach San Francisco not later than Nov. 15, airmail letters and parcels not later than Dec. 7.

United Kingdom and Europe—surface letters must reach Montreal by Dec. 1, parcels by Nov. 26, airmail letters by Dec. 14, airmail parcels by Dec. 13.

Indochina—surface mail must be posted by Oct. 15. Airmail going via army post office 56, New Delhi, India, may be posted as late as Nov. 30.

### British Sub Grounds In Firth of Clyde

ROTHESAY, Scotland (AP)—The British submarine Anchorage ran aground in the Firth of Clyde Friday night and was left high and practically dry by a receding tide.

The 1,120-ton vessel struck bottom as she entered Rothesay Bay. The Royal Navy said there was no likelihood of danger to the 68-man crew.
