Can Saskatchewan Roughriders build a late-season thrust on Frank Tripuka's arm and Ed Buchanan's speed?

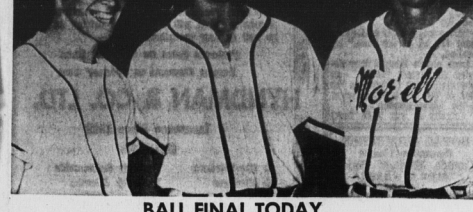
The possibility was strong enough to coach Bob Shaw Friday to make him bury the 24-year-old halfback from Calgary Stampede.
