PROPOSED NEW EDUCATION PROGRAMS

In September 1971 the Dean of Education, in consultation with the Faculty of Education, set up a Steering Committee to advise the Dean on the devising of new education programs and their implementation.

The Committee was representative of every educational institution on the Island: The Department of Education, The School Trustees Association, The Teachers Federation, the students, the Alumni, The

Home and School Association, and the three University Faculties. That the present Report was achieved by consensus speaks worlds for the genial, most competent chairmanship of our Dr. Roy Campbell, an Islander himself.

The next stage is for this report to be considered by Faculty; thereafter, a draft program will be submitted to the Academic Planning Committee. If the Academic Planning Committee

approves it, then the plan goes to Senate for approval.

The Faculty has three student representatives with full voting rights and privileges. They are: Diane Brennan, Brian Zalewski, and Peter Noonan. They will be happy to provide any further information students may seek, as of course will teaching members of faculty.

When the draft proposals are formulated for submission to the Academic Planning Committee, a copy of them will be offered to the Cadre; and any comments that students may care to make through their representatives to us will be most welcome.

Day Care Centre

DAY CARE CENTRE

There is now a good thing on campus for all the married students with children. It's the Day Care Centre located on the first floor of the Barn. The Day Care Centre was organized by the student-parents and is sponsored by the P.E.I. government. The centre is open to all children of students and staff of UPEI. The maximum charge is 50¢ an hour and the minimum charge is nothing. The charge is related to the income of the parents.

The Centre has Mrs. Joyce MacKay, a former nurse in the children's ward of the Ch'town hospital, as Supervisor. The Centre also has one part-time worker and some of the mothers lend a helping hand occasionally.

The kids range in age from 3 mos. to 5 years. They do all the "fun but educational things kids are supposed to do at a day nursery." They ARE having fun and they ARE doing educational things but parents are only paying (for the maximum charge) only half the cost for an untrained babysitter without the advantages of the Day Care Center with a trained staff.
