IMPOSSIBLE TO HOLD SPION KOP

And General Warren Forced to Abandon It.

POSITION EVIDENTLY AT THE MERCY OF THE BOERS.

No Further Information From the War Office.

General Woodgate has succumbed to his wounds—Major De Rougement killed in a minor engagement—The recruiting of Strathcona's Horse.

McDONALD IN COMMAND.

MORDER RIVER, Jan. 25.—General Hector Archibald McDonald has arrived and assumed command of the Highlanders.

ATTACKED IN REAR.

SPEARMAN'S CAMP.—Jan. 23, (delayed).—The Boers around Colenso advanced on the British camp at Chieveley today, getting back of the British who opened an artillery fire on them.

Captain Derougement, of the Light Horse, was killed in the fighting. Six men were wounded and two are missing.

STRATHCONA'S HORSE.

OTTAWA, Jan. 25.—It has been decided that Lord Strathcona's Horse will concentrate at Ottawa.

"THE ENTERING WEDGE."

LONDON, Jan. 26.—On receipt of General Buller's report it was at once forwarded to the Queen, Lord Salisbury and other ministers.

The general opinion is that Buller has succeeded in driving the entering wedge, and that the relief of Ladysmith is not far off.

Advices have been received from Spearman's Camp that General Woodgate has succumbed to the wounds received in the attack upon Spion Kop.

NO NEWS.

LONDON, Jan. 26.—At two o'clock this morning we know only as much as we did at ten o'clock yesterday morning. General Buller's despatch announcing the taking of Spion Kop is the only intelligence which has reached London, and that is so brief that we have little detail of what has happened.

LATER.

SPION KOP ABANDONED.

LONDON, Jan. 26.—The War Office has just posted the following despatch from General Buller, dated at Spearman's camp, Thursday, January 25th, noon: "General Warren's garrison, I am sorry to say, in the night abandoned Spion Kop."

LONDON, Jan. 26.—General Warren has abandoned Spion Kop, or that portion of it that he captured on Tuesday night.

Instead of making the position of the Boers untenable, as General Buller cabled that Warren thought he had done, the Boers attacked General Warren so fiercely with artillery and rifle fire that he was compelled to withdraw to the position he held before the night attack.

The fact is that the Boers purposely allowed the British to take the position on Spion Kop which the Burgers had made untenable, and when General Warren rushed into the trap they pounded him with shot and shell.

They prevented the British from bringing up any big guns in such a position that they could be used effectively.

It is believed that the British losses are very heavy.

REVOLUTION IN CHINA.

Believed that the Emperor has been Murdered

SHANGHAI, Jan. 26.—The Emperor has been deposed and a son of the fifth prince has been declared Emperor.

LATER.

It is reported that the Emperor Kuang Su committed suicide last night. But there is a general belief that he was murdered.

British Raise Funds in China.

TORONTO, Jan. 24.—Writing from Shanghai to a friend here, W. H. Boyd, formerly of Toronto, says that patriotic feeling is high among the British at Hong Kong and Shanghai. In the former place, he says, \$50,000 was raised for the patriotic fund in two days, while in Shanghai the collection greatly exceeded that amount.

BYE ELECTIONS, GOVERNMENT DEFEATED.

Sherbrooke, Winnipeg and Lotbiniere

RETURN OPPOSITION CANDIDATES

Though Government Money Flowed Freely

MONTREAL, Jan. 27.—The three bye-elections held yesterday resulted in black eyes for the Government.

In Sherbrooke, the Hon. John McInnes (Conservative) was elected by 28 majority, in spite of the fact that Laurier, Fielding, Tarte, Fisher and Patterson took an active part in the contest, while Foster and Bergeron were the only Opposition Leaders who took part in the campaign.

Liberal money was spent more than freely.

The Liberals were cocksure of victory, and during the last few days of the fight offered odds on LeBaron, the Liberal candidate.

In Winnipeg, Mr. Martin, (a brother of Joe Martin) who had been turned down by the Sifton party, was elected by about 60 majority.

In Lotbiniere there were two Liberals in the fight, and once more the Government candidate lost their nominee, Boisvert being defeated by Fortier, (an independent Liberal) by 164.

Take Guns and Town.

MANILA, Jan. 24.—Two companies of the Forty-sixth infantry, under Major Johnson, and three companies of the Thirty-eighth Infantry, commanded by Major Muir, defeated 800 insurgents at Tsal, province of Batangas, on Saturday, taking the town.

The United States gunboat Marietta also shelled the place. The insurgents had four cannon, two of which were captured. Two Americans were wounded and ten dead insurgents were found on the field.

The plague statistics show a total of 14 cases and 11 deaths.
