30 Houses To Be Built In Co-op Plan

Approximately 30 new homes will be built in several areas of the province under the government's co-operative housing program.

Housing Commission chairman Reid Sangster said yesterday that 20 housing groups in Charlottetown, one in Souris, one in Wellington, and possibly one in Morell plan to start building this spring.

100 HOMES BUILT
During the past three years,

Mr. Sangster said, about 100 homes have been built under the co-operative plan and 96 of those are now under mortgage and the rest will be shortly.

Mr. Sangster said "it is the feeling of the commission that the housing program so far is progressing favorably and can be very beneficial, not only in the present areas, but to many other areas of the province." At present, the commission is registering its rules and regulations so that they will work more uniformly with the province's Housing Act.

Fraud Charge Results In 30-Day Term

A charge of fraud against Gordon Stanley MacInnis, Charlottetown, resulted in a sentence of 30 days being imposed on the accused by Magistrate James B. Johnston in Queens County Magistrate's Court yesterday.

Charged with damage to seven mailboxes and a highway sign, Raymond Francis Griffin, Charlottetown, received fines totalling \$85 and costs, and was required to pay compensation for damages.

Evidence for the crown was given by Mrs. Helen M. Bovyager, Bumbury, and John Joseph Gerard Griffin, Scotchfort, testified on behalf of the accused.

The case of Mrs. James Brander, New London, charged with assault, was adjourned by consent to May 1 for judgment.

Two persons were charged with driving overweight vehicles on the highway. One was fined \$10 and costs or five days, and the other received a fine of \$5 and costs or two days.

Newton MacKay, Parkdale, charged with failing to make available for inspection books and records under the Unemployment Insurance Act, was fined \$10 and costs or five days.

For having in his possession liquor in a place other than his residence, an accused was fined \$20 and costs or 30 days.

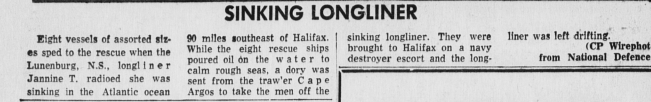
