Saint Mary's opened the scoring in the first quarter with a touchdown by Bailey, and a convert kicked by Kozak.

The Panthers tried to come back to even the score, but it was not until the second quarter that Thornburg broke the ice with a major. The convert attempt was blocked.

Then the Huskies really went to town, humbling the Panthers with three unanswered touchdowns scored by Clark, Bailey and Spree. Kozak was good for three

more converts..

At half-time the score stood 28-6 in S.M.U.'s favour.

IN the third quarter, the Huskies advanced steadily down the field from their own one-yard line to score yet another touchdown and convert, both by Kozak. The two teams held each other in check the rest of the time.

It was not until the last quarter that the Panthers got on the scoreboard again. Jim Paoline scored a touchdown from the Huskies 5 yard line. Mancuso's convert attempt was foiled when the ball bounced off the goal post.

A scoring thrust by U.P.E.I. late in the game was stopped by a S.M.U. interception. To top that off, two roughing penalties were called against the home team.

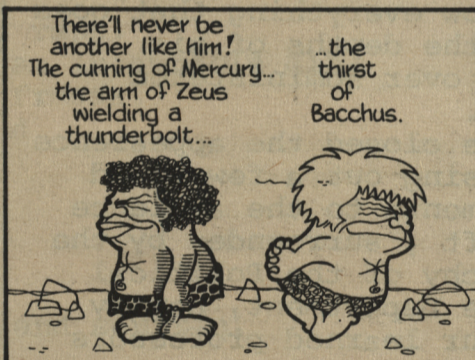

The P.E.I. SENIOR Volleyball League held its second weekly night of competition, at the Provincial Vocational Institute on Thursday night, Oct. 7th.

After the first night of competition held at C.F.B. S'side, U.P.E.I. was leading with

a 5-1 win loss record, followed by the Senior "y" Ripoffs at 4 wins no losses.

However on the second night U.P.E.I. lost four of the six games they played. They dropped two games to the Ripoffs: 15-9, 15-7; two games to the Pumas: 15-5, 16-14; and they defeated the Junior stars 15-4, 15-10,
