

Can Recognize Mink Diseases

TORONTO (CP)—New diagnostic methods enable recognition of a disease capable of wiping out entire mink ranches, the laboratory section of the Canadian Public Health Association was told Tuesday.

T. J. Priddy of Ontario Veterinary College's pathology and bacteriology department told the association—recently occurred in six Ontario mink ranches. Up to 90 per cent of the mink died.

The disease has been known since 1908 but has never before been reported in mink and could not be properly identified in other animals because of poor diagnostic methods.

Toxoplasmosis in humans usually causes fever, a rash and infection of the iris and retina of the eye. It is not usually fatal.
