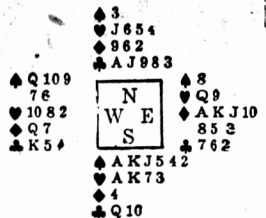
**Contract Bridge**

East dealer. North-South vulnerable.



The bidding:  
East 2♦ South 3♦ West North  
Pass 3♦ Pass 4♣  
Pass Pass

The East-West pair were using weak two-bids—a system in which two clubs is the only opening force. (As a matter of fact, East's hand was too strong for this approach; even under his system, one diamond or three diamonds would have been more constructive.) South's cue bid was the best way to cope with the situation, and

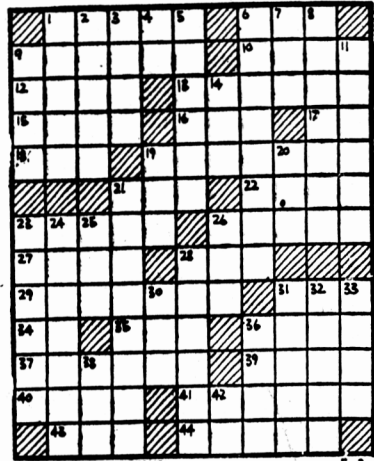

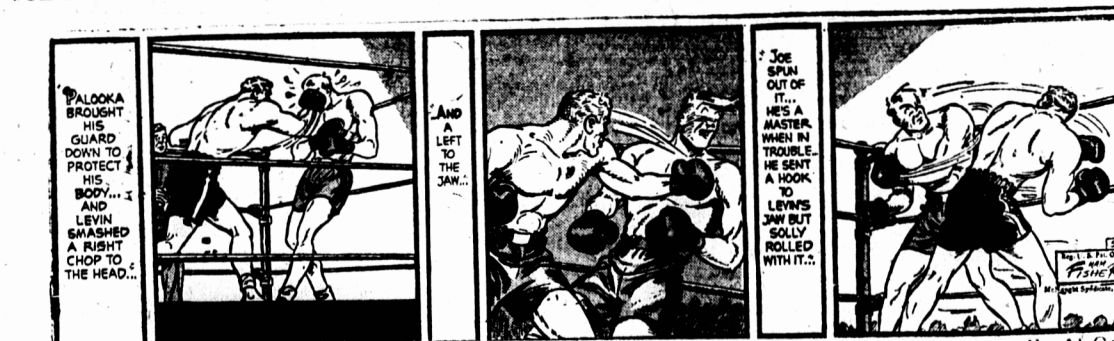
