IN MEMORIAM

JAMES M. MacFADYEN
James M. MacFadyen passed suddenly in the Prince Edward Island Hospital on August 15, 1958. Although he had been suffering from a heart ailment for the past eleven years, his death came as a distinct shock to his wide and many friends. During this period he had frequently been hospitalized under the care of his physician. The late Mr. MacFadyen was born at St. Catharines, Prince Edward Island on March 25, 1892, one of the youngest in a family of eleven sons and daughters of Hugh John and MacFadyen of Hunter's River and Sarah. Mrs. Alex MacLeod of Charlottetown.

As a boy, James M. MacFadyen attended the district school at St. Catharines and helped his father on the farm. In 1910 he went to Providence, Rhode Island and remained until 1917 when he returned to his home district to resume farming. On December 31, 1919 he married, Minnie, daughter of the late Reverend Daniel and Mrs. MacLean. In 1925 he began employment with his brother-in-law Neil D. MacLean, in the undertaking business. Later he entered into partnership with Aben MacLean in the retail grocery business, under the name of MacLean and MacFadyen, Queen Street, Charlottetown.

In 1934 he was appointed by the North Shore Hotels Company as manager of Stanhope Beach Inn, and at a later date manager of Dalway House. A few years later he purchased Stanhope Beach Inn, but in 1947 he was forced by ill health to sell the hotel to Mr. Raoul Raymond, and to relinquish his lease of Dalway House to Major Wendell Worth. In 1948 he acquired the property at Stanhope Beach, now known as Kilar Lodge. The late James M. MacFadyen was a devotee of the Church of Scotland, and for a number of years of trustees of Zion Presbyterian Church, Charlottetown. He also taught a Bible class for adolescents for a period of more than ten years. His community interests included the local Y.M.C.A. and he was especially concerned with the construction of the new building at the corner of Prince and Euston Streets. He was associated with Mr. Justice Arsenault in organizing the P. E. I. Motor League. He was a past-president of the Y's Men's Club, the Prince Edward Island Bible Society, and the Caledonia Club.

The funeral service, which was largely attended, was held from Zion Church on Monday August 18 with his pastor, the Reverend W. Harold Brown, officiating. In the course of his remarks, based on Romans 8, verse 28, the Reverend Mr. Brown referred to Mr. MacFadyen's greatness of soul and implicit faith in Christian principles. The choir under the direction of Mrs. Edwin Johnson led the congregation in singing two favorite selections of the deceased - "The Lord's My Shepherd" and "O God of Bethel".

Interment was in the People's Cemetery, Charlottetown. The pallbearers were: Walter R. Shaw, George Kiely, Kenneth M. Martin, William E. Agnew, John A. Martin and Malcolm MacKenzie. U.K. Capital Investment In Alberta Grows Rapidly

Canadian Press Staff Writer EDMONTON (CP) - It used to be that a prospective British investor in Canada bought a ticket on the CPR and took off for the west coast. He might stop off in Calgary en route. All he saw was the south. Now he's coming to Edmonton to take a look at the oil industry and northern development in general. And he's stopping here - with his money.

Idris Davies' job as United Kingdom trade commissioner in Alberta is not to try to convince British industrialists and investors that northern Alberta is better than southern Alberta for investment. He simply wants them to have a more thorough look at the province as a whole. The tall, lean native of Cardiganshire in Wales spent eight years in Whitehall, specializing in Canadian affairs, before he came here 14 months ago. He asked for the post as he has a "special regard" for the Canadian west.

REPORTS TO LONDON
From his office in a seven-man staff sends to London a steady stream of economic reports on Alberta - the south as well as the north. They tell British investors a story of a bustling, bustling province rapidly being opened up to development and to hurry and get in on it. "There is no difficulty in getting dollars from the treasury," said Mr. Davies in an interview.

Fighting In Beirut Flares
BEIRUT (CP) - Lebanese troops and tanks moved into the centre of Beirut Wednesday after a day of fighting that marred President Fuad Chehab's first day in office. The order to shoot on sight anyone illegally carrying weapons was the most drastic since the outbreak last May of a revolt against the old regime of Camille Chamoun.

U.K. Capital Investment In Alberta Grows Rapidly

"Not for something wildly speculative, mind you, but for sound investment such as the oil industry and manufacturing." Mr. Davies said he "can't begin to estimate" how many millions of dollars of British money has come into Alberta in the last few years. Britain's investment in Canada now is estimated at close to \$3,000,000,000 and the Hawker Siddeley Group, with 33 manufacturing plants and 65,000 workers, claims to be the country's second largest employer. The Canadian Pacific Railway is Canada's largest company.

An incomplete list shows 26 major Alberta companies either wholly owned by British firms or with some British capital. Many manufacture equipment for the oil industry, a field that until recent years was dominated by United States firms. Wood and paper products, chemicals, textiles, vegetable products - the commissioner recited a long list of industries in which British capital is invested. The latest British investment was announced last week. It was relatively small. The 101-year-old Furnee Co. Ltd. of London, comparable in many ways in its history of trading and investment throughout the world to the Hudson's Bay Company, announced it had acquired controlling interest in Alberta Oil Tool. It will manufacture precision oilfield fittings, never before made in Canada. Output will be worth about \$2,000,000 a year.
