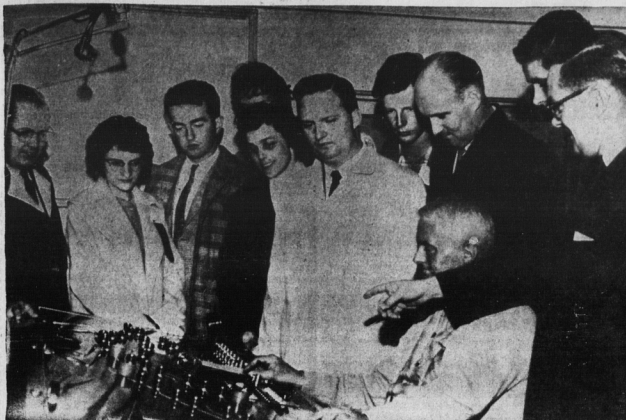

Crisis Arises Over Kenya Independence

Progress Good On Highway Conversion

Three contracts have been let and a good program has been made in preparing the Bonshaw to Borden Trans-Canada Highway into an all-weather highway.

Highways Minister Phillip Matheson said 22 miles of the road will be re-paved and slow lanes put on hills for slow moving trucks.

One side effect of the new construction, Mr. Matheson said, is that many snow traps on the hills will be removed. "It should be a wonderful road for the winter," he said.

Mr. Matheson indicated that the whole action may not be completed by winter but there will be enough new highway so that extensive tests by the highways department can be carried out.

It is planned that at spring weight restrictions will not be in force so that the performance of the new and old highways can be compared.

LONDON (Reuters)—A demand to declare Kenya independent within five days threatened to break up the three-week-long constitutional talks in progress here.

Kenya cabinet ministers in Nairobi cabled Prime Minister Jomo Kenyatta to call off the talks and return home to declare the British East African colony independent next Sunday.

Britain has named Dec. 12 as Kenya's independence day.

A Kenya government spokesman said Kenyatta and his delegation were taking the cable "very seriously" and would consider it at a meeting this morning.

Although the future of the talks was still in the balance there was still some hope of a negotiated settlement, observers said.

The Kenya delegation is said to be angered by what they regard as back-tracking moves by British Colonial Secretary Duncan Sandys.

Oyster Hatchery Nearing Completion At Bidford

The first of its kind in the world, the experimental oyster hatchery at Bidford, now nearing completion is designed to mass-produce large-scale oyster production techniques with the object of stepping up oyster production tremendously.

If the experiment is successful, it is hoped to translate the results effectively into the field of oyster rearing.

Roy Drinnan, officer in charge of the Fisheries Research Board station, is enthusiastic over the possibilities. Though he stressed "there is still a great deal of work to be done," the hatchery which should be completed within two months, will make it possible to hatch up to 40,000,000 oyster larvae, and that figure is so fantastical, he says there is almost impossible to grasp its meaning.
