

Large Docket Is Feature Of Geo'town Court Session

MONTAGUE—A large docket of cases was heard by Magistrate James B. Johnston, QC, at Georgetown yesterday.

A charge of joy riding against Gerald Wm. Cronin and James Herbert Williams, both of Cardigan was withdrawn in each case by the crown following the hearing of the evidence of Pius Wm. MacPhee of Cardigan North who was the informant. Both Cronin and Williams were represented by J.P. Nicholas.

A charge of hit and run was laid against James Herbert Williams of Cardigan when he failed to stop after an accident with a vehicle owned by Cecil James Rice of Cardigan. The accused who earlier in the court entered a plea of not guilty through his counsel J.P. Nicholson later changed his plea to one of guilty and was fined \$30.00 and costs.

CASE ADJOURNED

George Ivan MacKeown of Montague who is charged with the care and control of a motor vehicle while impaired and who was represented by S.S. Heenan QC, had this case adjourned by consent to March 29th.

Gordon Stanley MacLennan of Charlottetown charged with impaired driving and who was represented by J.P. Nicholson had a plea of not guilty entered by his counsel and the case was adjourned to Charlottetown on March 21st, at which time a date will be set to proceed with the case.

Nathaniel Wallace Campbell of Alliston pleaded not guilty to having liquor which had not been purchased from a vendor and had his case adjourned by consent to March 29th.
