

# Prince County Man Dies In Hospital From Burns

Mr. Joseph A. Doucette, 62, died at the Western Hospital in Alberton about 5 o'clock yesterday morning from severe burns received in a tragic accident at his home in DeBlois the previous evening.

As far as can be learned Mr. Doucette was reading, sitting close to an Aladdin lamp, and it is presumed his clothing caught fire from the heat of the lamp. Mrs. Doucette, who was alone in the house with her husband, was upstairs when she heard him calling for help and on coming down she found the window curtains on fire. After putting out the fire with water she opened the outside door and saw her husband lying on the ground engulfed in flames. She quickly extinguished the flames and managed to get the accident victim into the house before going to a neighbor's for help.

# Don Cockell Mixes Magic With Training

EASTBOURNE, England, (AP) —England's Don Cockell hopes to wrest the heavyweight championship from Rocky Marciano with "positive thinking."

Cockell's manager, John Simpson, who says the pudgy British heavy is mixing "psychology and nature healing" with his gym work for the May 16 fight in San Francisco.

"It is thought treatment," Simpson said, "good thoughts bring good acts. Confidence brings success. If you think like a hoodlum you act like a hoodlum. If you think success you help your chance for success."

Cockell's manager said Don was studying psychology and nature healing under an eminent London nature healer, Sydney Miller.

The idea, he pointed out, is for Cockell to lift his mind to such a state of confidence that—almost simply by thinking—he can erase the 5 to 1 odds now being quoted against him.

Cockell has another secret weapon he is saving for the big championship chance. It's the so-called telepathic one-two punch. This also is a brainchild of nature healer Miller, who sits at the ringside and sends telepathic telegrams, or communications, by brain waves.

When Cockell fails to duck and dodge busted in the jaw, Miller sends up a quick telepathic message that it didn't hurt a bit and do go on and hit back.

There's one complication. Suppose Marciano cuts loose one of his famous knockout blows and puts the receiving station out of commission. Simpson doesn't know about that.

The proposal came from Senator Muriel McQueen Ferguson (L.-N.W. Brunswick), one-time member of the New Brunswick bar.

# RAISES DIVORCES

Canada should not pass an act similar to one which, since its passage in the U.K., had upped the divorce rate there to 50,000 cases a year.

Sensor Ferguson noted that the English legislation from which the bill was copied was based on the report of a U.K. royal commission which made its report in 1912. Conditions had changed since then in both the U.K. and in Canada.

# U. S. Demand For Steel Mounting

NEW YORK, (AP)—The steel market is being pushed to a demand-supply crisis by the general industrial recovery in the United States. Iron Age, the national metal-working weekly, says.

The outlook for steel business in the third quarter is getting stronger, it adds, reporting as follows:

More consumers are paying full warehouse prices for relatively small tonnages due to delayed mill deliveries. The mills, in turn, are running into shortages of shipping space. Lack of trucks has piled up 6,500 tons of finished steel at one mill in the Midwest. Others are having similar difficulties.
