**WHIRING THE SAHARA.**  
The telephone and the telegraph are rapidly making inroads into the arid portions of the Desert of Sahara. Engineer Bayle is now on the way from Biskra to Tougurt with a working force of 100 men for the purpose of laying telegraph wires between the two places. The line is erected as the party proceeds, and the first news from Bayle was received at Biskra when he telephoned from a point some twenty miles south of Biskra. He advances at the rate of from three to five miles a day, and will probably reach Tougurt about the first of the year. He reports over the phone that he has met with a peculiar difficulty; the camels which he has taken along are not used to carrying burdens of a long shape like telegraph poles, and in many cases they refuse to go on with their loads. Each camel was loaded with four poles, two being strapped to each side, the smaller ones dragging on the ground. Bayle found it necessary to leave behind half of his poles at stated points, and continue on the trip with the lightened burden; since only short distances are covered at a time, he then sends the camel drivers back for the rest of the load, and in this way the poles are transported without being dragged on the ground. Since the camels will not carry the poles when strapped alongside of them, he had to resort to the peculiar mode of balancing the telegraph poles across the pack saddles, and fastening them in this position by means of straps and ropes. From a little distance it is quite curious to see a line of camels, each with its right side to behold the file of camels with their swinging gait, and a load extending many feet to each side. One would think that a drove of gigantic birds with spread wings were sailing over the desert.
