

### Swiacki Will Not Return As Argo Coach

TORONTO (CP) — Bill Swiacki will not return as Toronto Argonauts' head coach in 1957, general manager Lew Hayman of the Big Four Football Union club said Monday.

"There was a note for me when I arrived at the office this morning," he said.

"It was from Swiacki saying that he wouldn't be coming back to Toronto because he had other plans for 1957."

Hayman said Swiacki didn't return from Montreal, where the team played the Alouettes Saturday, and apparently has returned to his home in the United States. The regular Big Four season ended Saturday.

Swiacki has been Argonaut coach for two seasons. He is a former end with Columbia University and Detroit Lions of the National Football League and a former end coach with the Lions and New York Giants.

### Mayer Says Olympics Must Take Place

LAUSANNE, Switzerland (AP) — Otto Mayer, chancellor of the International Olympic Committee said Monday the Melbourne Olympic Games "must take place" whatever the world situation.

Mayer sent a cable to the Netherlands Olympic Committee asking it to reject proposals that The Netherlands would withdraw from the Melbourne games in protest against the Soviet suppression of Hungary.

Mayer said his cable "expressed the wish of the international committee that The Netherlands team should not withdraw for political reasons — and that applies to all national teams."

Mayer said: "The Olympic Games must take place. They must be allowed to make their contribution to friendship between nations and fulfill their humanitarian role in the interests of peace."

Mayer said two French charter planes were expected to reach Prague Monday night to take the Hungarian Olympic team to Melbourne.

### Money Prime Consideration, Is Report

MONTREAL (CP) — A French-language youth organization says a survey shows that money is the prime consideration of young men and women now employed.

With salary their sole concern, few young men and women take any interest of pride in their work, said the organization. Some state from their place of employment; others wasted time while at work; still others arrived late; and some paid no attention to merchandise or instruments placed in their care.

The survey was conducted by La Jeunesse Ouvriere Catholique (Young Catholic Workers) among 85 girls and 145 young men in 27 towns in Quebec and New Brunswick. Average age of those interviewed was 19.

More than 97 per cent of the young men said their main reason for working is to earn money. About 32 per cent said they wanted the money to pay for amusement and entertainment. Others said they wanted the money to pay for their livelihood, to improve their status in life or to help their families.

Among the girls, 70 per cent of them said they are working to earn their livelihood. Others said they are working to help their families or to prepare for marriage.

On the average, the young men and women changed positions at least twice each during 3 1/2 years of work.

The survey noted that the young workers showed little or no interest in their fellow employees. Few participated in activities connected with their place of employment.

### Canadian Pilot Killed In France

METZ, France (CP) — A Canadian pilot was killed Monday when his Sabre jet fighter crashed a few miles north of Strasbourg, France.

An RCAF spokesman said the plane was on a routine training flight from its base at the RCAF's No. 4 fighter wing, Zaden-Solligen, Germany.

Cause of the accident is not yet known and the name of the pilot has been withheld until next-of-kin are notified.

It was the second crash in two days involving planes from Canada's NATO air division in Europe. Sunday, a CF-100 twin-jet night fighter crashed near Perth, Scotland, on a flight from Canada to Marville, France. The CF-100 was part of a 20-plane squadron being flown to France to replace a single-engine Sabre squadron.

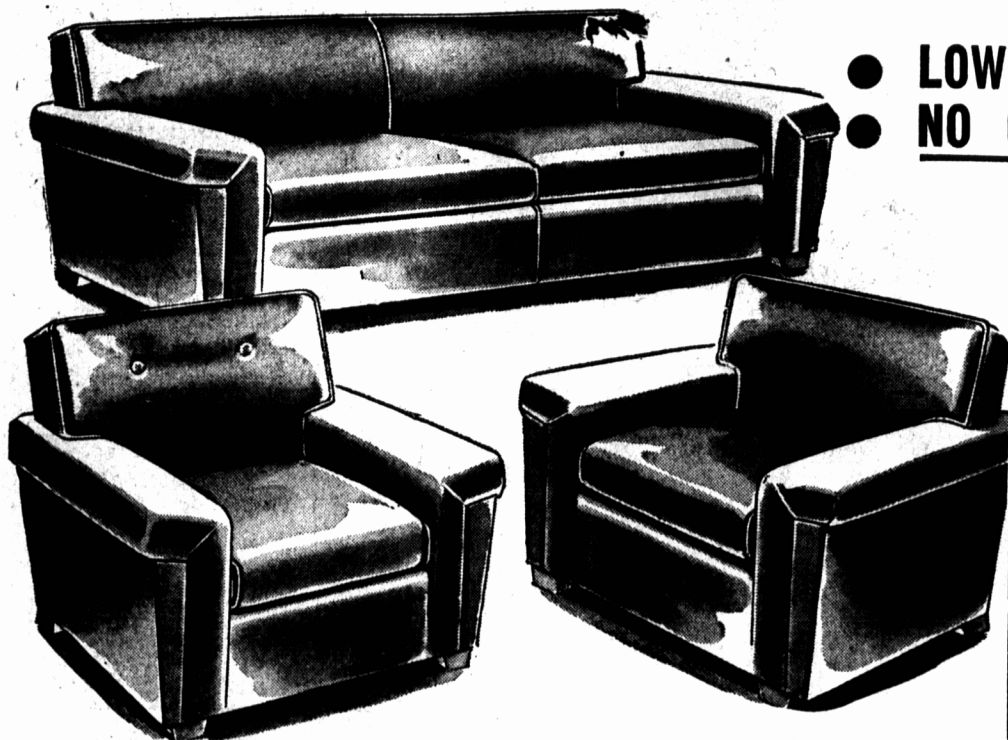

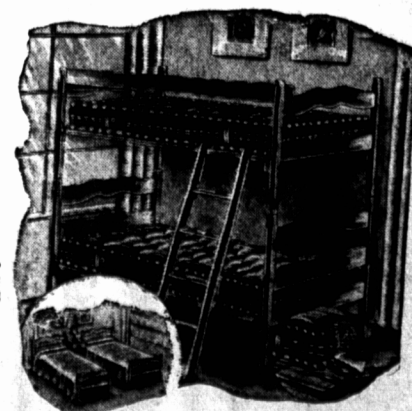
