A New Cunarder.

NEW YORK, April 25.—The new Cunard line steamer Ivernia arrived yesterday from Liverpool and Queenstown on her maiden trip with 182 cabin and 1735 steerage passengers, and the usual consignment of mail. The Ivernia is commanded by Captain Alexander McKay. Her gross tonnage is 13,688; length 600 feet over all. On her trial trip she averaged 16.8 knots. She has twin screws and her engines are of 10,000 indicated horse power.
