B.C. Telephone Develops Apartment Dweller Aid

VANCOUVER (CP)—The British Columbia Telephone Company has developed a system in which a tenant can open the door of his apartment building by dialing a number on his telephone.

The company says the development will be a boon to apartment builders, tenants and owners of older apartment buildings that have no door-answering systems.

At present many apartments have their own communication system with the lobby of the building.

When a visitor wishes to be admitted to the building he calls an apartment, identifies himself and the tenant pushes a button that electronically releases the lock on the building door.

Under the B.C. Telephone development a caller will push a button in the lobby which will set off a special ring in a tenant's regular telephone set.

JUST DIAL To open the building door the tenant will simply dial the digits "4" on his telephone.

The company has developed arrangements to cover all possibilities.

If the tenant is talking on the telephone, a subdued tone will come on the line when somebody calls from the building entrance. The tenant will be able to have his telephone caller wait while he talks to the entrance and unlocks the door.

If the tenant is talking to a visitor at the door when a telephone call comes through, he'll get a signal as soon as he hangs up on the visitor.

IT'S CHEAPER The company says the installation and maintenance costs will be cheaper than those of two separate communications systems.

It owns the new system aids owners of older buildings who cannot afford to install the costly door-answering system.

This system can be put into any building, old or new, because it requires no extra wiring over the regular telephone circuits.

Canadian Opera Company Announces Coming Season

TORONTO (CP)—The Canadian Opera Company announced Wednesday the six works it will present this season, along with plans for a mid-winter tour of 60 Canadian and United States cities.

The company will open its regular season Sept. 12 with a three-week engagement at the O'Keefe Centre here and will begin a 14-week tour in January.

The tour will take the company through Ontario, several U.S. cities, Quebec, Newfoundland and the Maritimes.

The works to be performed include: Turandot by Puccini, starring Jeannine Crader of the New York City Opera, Giuseppe Campora of the Metropolitan Opera and Howell Glynn of the Covent Garden Opera.

The Barber of Seville by Rossini, featuring Alexander Gray and Barbara Stratheede of the Canadian company.

Rigoletto by Verdi, starring Peter Glossop of Covent Garden, Gianni Savelli of Teatro Fenice of Venice and Mr. Glynn.

La Boheme by Puccini, starring Dorothy Coulter of the Metropolitan Opera and Jean Bonhomme of Covent Garden; Stravinsky's Mavra with Sheila Piercey and Dodi Protero of the Canadian company and Salome by Strauss starring Margaret Tynes of the Vienna State Opera.
