Ismael Laguna Defeats Ortiz

PANAMA (AP)—Ismael Laguna, a 21-year-old Panamanian who turned pro four years ago, is the new world's lightweight boxing champion.

He dethroned Carlos Ortiz, a 28-year-old Puerto Rican from New York, with a 15-round split decision before 18,000 in Olympic Stadium Saturday night.

Ortiz had won the championship from Joe Brown in Las Vegas three years ago and had retained it in four previous title bouts. The last time was a year ago against Kenny Lane of Muskegon, Mich. in San Juan.

The speedy Laguna, virtually unknown outside Panama, survived Ortiz's bull-like charges with lightning return barrages that left Ortiz hanging on at the end.

Referee Jersey Joe Walcott of Camden, N.J., the former heavyweight champion, and Panamanian judge Ramon Inez voted for Laguna 143-132 and 149-137, respectively. Judge Ben Green of New York called it a draw 145-145. Green's vote was loudly booed and he left the stadium under police protection.

"It was not my night," Ortiz said. "Laguna is a great fighter. He is very fast and deserved to win the title. I was sluggish because I had not fought a really hard fight since last April."

The jubilant Laguna, fighting for the first time as a lightweight, said "I expect to retain the title as long as I can make the weight."

Laguna's wildmill tactics had Ortiz in trouble from the third round on. By the sixth, Ortiz's right eye had taken on a pinkish tinge. In the seventh a cut appeared under his left eye, and it had swelled almost shut when the fight ended.

Time after time Ortiz waded into Laguna's blistering barages, but was unable to land a kayo punch. There were no knockdowns.

Ortiz's best round was the ninth, although Laguna gave as good as he received. Thereafter Ortiz appeared winded and the partisan crowd began screaming for the kill.

N.S. Provincial Champions Capture Maritime Ch'ship

A classy midget hockey team from Antigonish, Nova Scotia captured the Maritime midget hockey championship by topping the Charlottetown Forum 6-2 in the third game of the two day round robin tournament played at the Charlottetown Forum.

The classy Nova Scotia representative polished off Fredericton 8-4 Saturday morning to hand the New Brunswick champions their second defeat. The Fredericton squad suffered a 9-7 setback Friday night at the hands of the Lorne Hennessey coached Island champions.

In Saturday nights contest the visiting forces outplayed the locals in every department and they were on top of the play throughout the game as they

outscored and outlasted the Charlottetown representative in their quest for the Maritime midget crown.

Archie MacDonald opened the scoring for the winners at the 4:24 mark of the first period and this marker stood up until the 16:57 mark when Charlottetown's Bobby Doherty found the range and beat the Antigonish netminder with a 15 foot drive low to his glove side on a pass from Bobby Whitlock. Brian Foley put the locals in the lead when he drilled one into the twines on a nice play in which Foley made no hesitation when he pulled the trigger on the blast.

The Nova Scotia champs continued their persistent attack and Oja of Antigonish beat Mike Brown, in the Charlottetown

cage when a teammate dug the puck out from behind the net and Oja shot from point blank range to make the scoreboard read 2-2 when the siren went to end the first stanza.

Play was scramble in the sandwich session and James MacDonald scored the only goal of the period when he broke away with one man back, stepped around the defenceman and then slipped the puck under the Charlottetown netminder as he was going down to block the shot. MacDonald's marker gave the visitors a 3-2 margin going into the final frame.

VISITORS TAKE OVER In the third period the local lads never entered the picture as the visitors turned on the speed to dominate the period. At the 1:35 mark James MacDonald fired his second goal off a three goal night when he beat Brown on the short side to give his teammates a comfortable 4-2 bulge. Archie MacDonald scored for the winning forces at the 13:40 mark and James MacDonald was back before the final siren went to complete his 'hat trick' and the Nova Scotia champions skated off with all the medals in the Maritime midget division and with the convicing 6-2 decision over the Prince Edward Island champions.

The player that impressed this writer most on the local squad was young Robert Stewart who is a strapping 165 pounder who is still eligible for pantam, but was brought up to bolster the Hennessey coached squad and more than held his own with the
