NEW YORK (AP)—Late selling spelled trouble for the stock market Tuesday, and it was able to hold to only a shred of its early advance.

Steel, motors and oils were in the forefront of the early advance but at the close motors were lower and the other two divisions were mixed.

In the late afternoon there was a rally in aftermarkets that sent them ahead strongly.

All gains, however, were cut by profit-taking.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was unchanged at 181.90.

General Motors topped the most active list off at 47 1/2 on \$3,100,000. It was followed by Westinghouse Electric up at 58 3/4 and U. S. Steel up 1/2 at 59.

Canadian issues were mixed. International Nickel added 1/4 and Dome Mines was up 1/2. Hiram Walker slipped 1/4 and Canadian Pacific and Distillers Seagram both fell 1/4. McIntyre remained unchanged.

On the American stock exchange, Giant Yellowknife and Royalite Oil remained unchanged and Lake Shore gained 1/4.

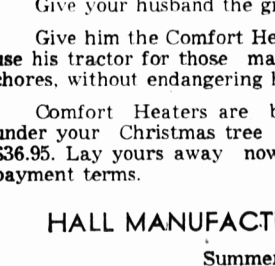

Eisenhower's "Open Sky" Plan Urged

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., (AP)—Henry Cabot Lodge, Jr., urged the UN political committee Monday to endorse President Eisenhower's "open sky" program for mutual aerial inspections of the Soviet Union and the United States.

The chief U. S. delegate drew a verbal picture of Soviet planes flying over the United States and United States planes flying over the Soviet Union on peaceful missions of aerial photography.

He said Nikita Khrushchev, Soviet Communist party chief, in a talk to an Indian audience Nov. 26 seemed "to find this picture fantastic."
