

Local Tobacco Advertising Outlawed In Alberta Town

CHARLSTON, Alta. (CP)—Local tobacco advertising has been outlawed in this town of 3,000 people in the Canada-United States border.

Town council, comprising seven non-smokers, last week approved the necessary bylaw and Mayor Dennis Burt said he hoped other Canadian centres would follow.

Mayor Burt, who quit smoking 10 years ago, said the council could do nothing about outside advertising of tobacco and tobacco products.

"We are concerned only with local advertising such as billboards, placards, handbills and such things. We hope others will follow our example and take such action," he said.

"It is time we took recognition of the magnitude of the smoking problem. Tobacco advertising should be banned in Canada. I feel this is a step in

the right direction and I hope others will follow."

The action was taken in the light of reports on the harmful effects of smoking issued by various medical associations, he added.

"Such advertising is not a problem in our town now. The action was taken as an example to others. I've never known a smoker anywhere who would recommend to someone else that they should smoke."

"I think more people should get behind the campaign of Health Minister Judy LaMarsh to discourage smoking."

The critical area involved young people, he said. Neither of his two teen-aged daughters smokes.

The bylaw states that: "No signs, billboards, placards, handbills and advertisements, either suggestive or

12-Mile Limit Bill Described As 'Clap-Trap'

OTTAWA (CP)—Frank Howard, New Democratic party MP for St. John's, said Saturday that unless the government provides more detailed information in establishing a 12-mile fishing limit, the bill now before Parliament will be nothing more than a dozen pages of legal clap-trap.

He said in a statement that the bill, in its present form, would preserve the status quo

otherwise the encourage or entice a person or persons to use by way of smoking, chewing or otherwise any tobacco, shall be prohibited in the town of Charlottetown.

Mr. Howard said that because of the protective provisions of the bill, "the ridiculous situation on the Atlantic Coast whereby Canada has not permitted its large trawlers to fish closer to the coast than 12 miles while at the same time allowing foreign trawlers to fish up to three miles will continue in effect."

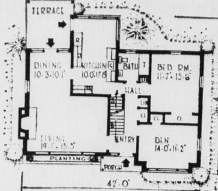

Soviet Union Removes Top Missiles From Cuba

WASHINGTON (AP)—Russia is believed to have taken home the top-grade anti-aircraft missiles it installed in Cuba, leaving Fidel Castro with second-class weapons to back up threats against U.S. surveillance flights.

This is the word in some Washington quarters as officials wait to see what Castro will do to support his assertion that "we will prevent these flights to the limits of what our weapons can do."

It could mean the limit of capability for the ground-launched missiles, apparently being turned over by the Russians in Cuban forces is less than when Soviet troops manned the 24 launching sites.

And this could mean that what Castro now has can't reach up to the altitude at which the U.S. surveillance planes have been flying on.
