TORONTO (CP)—The emphasis was again on livestock as the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair went into its fourth day Tuesday. Six rings were being worked to capacity with simultaneous judgments of horses and three breeds of cattle and auctions of lambs and hogs.

Nineteen events were judged for the Governor-General's Cup for three-year-olds and 15 for the Lieutenant-Governor's Trophy for non-thoroughbreds. Placings will not be announced until the presentations Thursday.

Raymond Vessey of York, P.E.I., was named winner in three potato classes, Irish cobbler, sebago and katahdin.

OTHER WINNERS: Whitley Judson, St. Peter's Bay, P.E.I., for C.K.C.H.; Arthur H. Budarick, Palmer Rapids, Ont. for green mountain; Alf Needoba, Salmon Arm, B.C., for netted grand champion bull. It was the third time he had won the grand championship since 1955.

The junior champion Ayrshire bull is owned by A. MacFae and sons of Charlottetown.

Jack Fraser of Concord, Ontario, won the grand championship Guernsey bull award with McDonald's Farm Royal Winston.

Grand champion Jersey is owned by B. H. Bull and Son and Mrs. F. A. Schulman of Brantford, Ontario.

In the Holstein class senior and grand champion bull was Rosate Signet, owned by J. J. E. McGague of Alliston, Ontario.

Report On Fluoridation Costs Soon

A complete report on the cost of fluoridating Charlottetown's water supply is expected to be released in a "few days". H.R. Bevan, chairman of the Commissioners of Sewers and Water Supply said yesterday.

Mr. Bevan stated the commission was now in possession of complete figures on the cost of machinery and material. Estimates on the cost of suitable meters is expected shortly, he said.

Cost estimates for the project are being compiled by a Halifax firm, Wallace and Tierney, which specializes in this type of installation.

The first brief endorsing fluoridation was presented to the commissioners in 1954. It was first brought before city council in 1954 and defeated by one vote. It passed by one vote when again presented in 1955. The resolution was again introduced some weeks ago and passed without a dissenting voice.
