Scottish - Born Royal Bank Head To Be Honored

LONDON, Oct. 11—(CP)—James Muir, Scottish-born president of the Royal Bank of Canada, arrived in London recently on his way to a local-boy makes-good ceremony in his home town. "Jimmy" Muir, as his class mates still call him, was born 73 years ago in a roadside cottage near Peebles, Scotland. Today, as president of Canada's largest bank, he went back to the scene of his boyhood to receive the freedom of the Royal and Ancient Burgh of Peebles.

As the freedom was conferred in the Town Hall of Peebles, Muir received his Burgess scroll from Provost Arthur Daniels, who, like Muir, started his career with the Commercial Bank of Scotland. Peebles is one of Scotland's most ancient royal burghs. Its honors, sparingly given, have gone to such famous men as William Ewart Gladstone, 19th-century Liberal prime minister, Field Marshal Sir Douglas Haig and the First Lord Tweedsmuir, who died in office while Governor-General of Canada.

A younger brother of the late Lord Tweedsmuir, J. W. Buchanan, is Town Clerk of Peebles. By a coincidence Buchanan was agent at the Commercial Bank when Muir started his career.

But the arm of coincidence has an even greater reach, historically speaking. The rural cottage where Muir was born, and where his two brothers still live, stands next door to a house owned by Capt. George Wolfe-Murray, direct descendant of the first Governor-General of Canada.

When Gen. James Wolfe was mortally wounded at the Battle of the Plains of Abraham in 1759, Gen. Murray took his place and later became governor-general. The Murray family changed its name to Wolfe-Murray by deed poll.

Muir left Scotland for Canada in 1912.

Cost-Of-Living In Canadian Cities

OTTAWA, Oct. 11—A "substantial" decline in the price of potatoes and other fresh vegetables pushed down living costs during August in eight of nine regional cities, the Bureau of Statistics reported recently.

Montreal's cost-of-living index remained unchanged as potato prices climbed slightly, offsetting declines in other vegetables. Egg prices rose generally, but meats and sugar were lower in all centres except Saskatoon. But Saskatoon's rents remained unchanged while they climbed in the eight other centres.

Coal prices rose in Toronto, Montreal and Saskatoon, but in Toronto, the boost was offset by lower coke prices. Coal prices were down slightly in Saint John, N. B.

The regional index, based on 1935-39 equals 100, for August with the July figure in brackets: Vancouver, 189.0 (189.5); Edmonton, 177.7 (179.1); Saskatoon, 182.7 (183.9); Winnipeg, 179.0 (180.0); Toronto, 183.3 (184.2); Montreal, 191.7 (191.7); Saint John, N. B., 183.9 (189.1); Halifax, 178.7 (179.0). The St. John's, Nfld., index, based on June 1951, equalling 100, declined to 103.6 on 105.3.

The indexes show changes in retail prices and services in each city. They do not indicate whether it costs more or less to live in one city than another. In a previous report, the Bureau estimated the national cost-of-living index at 186.5 during August, down 1.1 points from 187.6 during July. This index also is based on 1935-39 prices equalling 100.

WINNIPEG, Man., Oct. 11—Light snow and rain in Manitoba and scattered showers at some points in Alberta and Saskatchewan have again delayed completion of harvesting operations on the final crop report of the Department of Agriculture of the Canadian National Railways. Warm days and cool nights prevailed in the Okanagan Valley. McIntosh apples will be slightly under original estimate, on account of high winds in local districts but the general outlook continued very favorable. No damage from any other source is reported.

Controls Lifted On Newsprint And Woodpulp

OTTAWA, Oct. 11—(CP)—With world supplies more plentiful, newsprint and woodpulp have been removed from the government's essential materials list, the Defence Production Department announced yesterday.

The items were removed by order-in-council yesterday. This means the government no longer can control their price or distribution.

Newsprint and woodpulp were placed on the list last year to meet emergency rationing under the International Materials Conference. The I. M. C. committee dealing with these items now has been disbanded. The department's Newsprint and Woodpulp Division also has been closed.
