the ALTERNATIVE side in all of us.

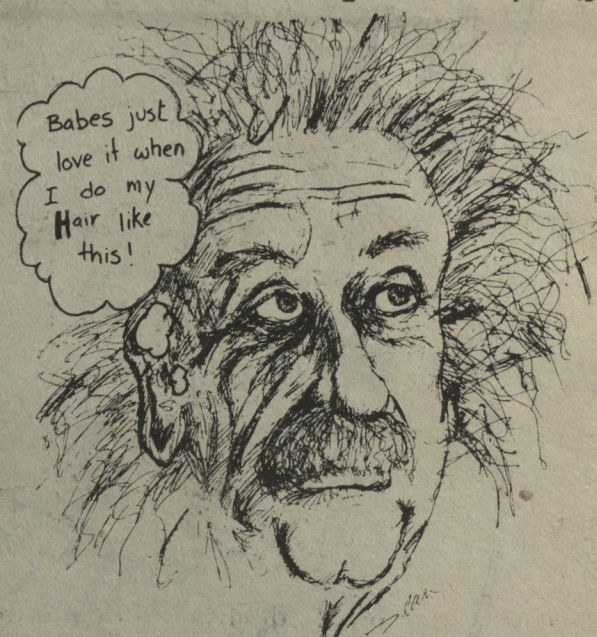
Senior Class Rep. Trent:
