Wants Support For Dictionary Of Canadian Words & Usage

KINGSTON, Ont. (CP)—As an author, Dr. Walter S. Avis finds himself in a unique situation.

He doesn't have to worry about sentences or story—but he has to hunt for words.

bhe ones he wants for his planned dictionary of Canadian words are those distinctive to the country.

Dr. Avis, assistant professor in the English department at Royal Military College here and secretary of the Canadian Linguistic Association, says that the distinctive language of English-speaking Canadians is one of the paths to national identity.

PURELY CANADIAN
Many words used by Canadians are intrinsically Canadian, he says. Many came into the lan-

guage through contact with the French - Canadians, Indians and Eskimos. And North America generally has a whole range of linguistic forms not current in England, a situation due in large part to the different environment of this continent.

As examples of words peculiar to Canada, Dr. Avis gives separate school, concession road, splake, Mountie, muskeg, fire reels, aboideau, Bennett - buggy, Bluenose, herring-choker, Newfie, malemate, mukluk, wendigo, bush pilot, pogy, hydro, chuck race, bluehline and many others.

Words with meanings peculiar to Canada include acclamation as in "he was elected by acclamation," a meaning current only in Canada. The terms "treaty Indian" and "treaty money" may be found in American dictionaries, but they are marked obsolete in spite of the fact they are very much alive in Canada.

The need for a Canadian dictionary, Dr. Avis says, is pointed up by regionalisms, words that mean one thing in, say, British Columbia and something different elsewhere. Thus we find persons in one part of the country referring to fire reels and in another to fire trucks.

OTHER EXAMPLES
The child's playthings, the teeter-totter, in Nova Scotia is called a tit. A bluff on the Prairies is a clump of trees, while elsewhere it is an escarpment. A salt lick in most of Canada refers to block salt placed for cattle, while in B.C. a salt lick is a topographical

feature. Work has already begun on the task of compiling the Canadian dictionary. A publishing house has been trying to establish a foundation to finance the project, working in conjunction with leading Canadian linguists.

"Needless to say," Dr. A. says, "this ambitious undertaking will not bear fruit for several years. If the foundation is
