Life Insurance in Canada

TORONTO, July 2.—Showing an increase of nearly 11 per cent, as compared with the same period last year, sales of new ordinary life insurance in Canada and Newfoundland for May totalled \$33,657,000 according to returns compiled by the Life Insurance Sales Research Bureau, and given out today by the Canadian Life Insurance Officers Association. All the Western Provinces reported increases. Saskatchewan leading with an improvement of over 29 per cent. In Ontario, which did nearly 50 per cent of the total business, sales were up over 18 per cent.
