## Ottawa-Island Sign \$90,000 Shipping Pact

A new three-year agreement between the federal and provincial governments, providing an annual \$90,000 subsidy for Gulf and Northern Shipping Company Limited, has been arranged by industry and Natural Resources Minister Leo Rossiter.

Mr. Rossiter said that this province pays \$18,000 per year on the subsidized service, which operates between this province and Newfoundland on a weekly basis.

Mr. Rossiter, who returned Wednesday from Ottawa, also announced that a new federal-provincial forestry agreement had been drawn up. The agreement will mean an additional \$15,000 to the province for its forestry program. Now the province will get \$40,000 per year for several years, instead of \$25,000 called for in the former agreement.

**HELD OTHER TALKS**  
The minister also held talks with trade and commerce officials on possibilities of exporting island products, such as building materials and farm produce. "While there is nothing to announce at this time," said Mr. Rossiter, "prospects look pretty good."

Northern Affairs Minister Walter Diasale was also consulted by Mr. Rossiter on the possibility of a revision of the federal-provincial agreement on parks.

"Under the present agreement," said Mr. Rossiter, "we are eligible for financial assistance if the money is spent on five sites in the province. We would like to have the agreement changed so that we can still spend money from Ottawa on a variety of sites."

### Resort Owners Make Bid To Solve Sign Problems

Hope for the successful working out of problems confronting tourist resort operators regarding highway signs was expressed Thursday by representatives of the industry following a meeting with Highways Minister Philip Matheson.

A delegation from the P.E.I. Tourist Association met with the minister yesterday and told him of the difficulties encountered a day asked for some amendment to regulations which would permit placing of reasonably sized advertisements in positions which point to their various places of business.

Without the opportunity of acquainting the motoring public with accommodations available the delegation felt it was difficult to operate in the manner necessary in view of the great investment involved.

Mr. Matheson said he would seek further information on how other provinces handle the matter and see if anything can be done to aid the industry here.
