C. B. C. Orchestra Tour Unlikely

OTTAWA (CP) — A European orchestra, project for next summer with a 2,000 Canada tour will not go through, sources here Monday.

The whole project is to be before the CBC board of directors, Thursday, with a request for a board decline, the tour would be off.

A CBC spokesman said Monday it now is being realized that touring for the tour, started about a year ago, got on-er way too late.

Such engagement commitments from impro- and concert hall managers at least a dozen centres if it is to pay its way, usually are up in contracts two years ahead.

Gregory Clark Dinner Held TORONTO (CP) — Gregory Clark, lauded as "this great Canadian reporter-philosopher," honored by his fellow members of the Canadian War Correspondents Association at a testimonial dinner Saturday night.

Associate editor of the magazine and a newspaperman for 47 of his 65 years, Mr. Clark was a war correspondent for Toronto Star in Sicily, Italy and on the Western Front in the war. He won the Military Cross at Vimy Ridge while serving in the 4th Canadian Mounted Regiment in the First World War.

Bill Stewart of Montreal, president of the CWCA, paid tribute to Mr. Clark not only as a reporter and philosopher but as a man with friends from all walks of life — taxi drivers and public school teachers, a humble soldier and great general.

Canadian In Cuba Arrested TORONTO (CP) — Andrew MacFarlane, a reporter for The Star, says he and a British television correspondent were arrested and questioned Monday night by secret police in the hotel at Santiago, Cuba.

In a dispatch from Santiago, Mr. MacFarlane says police released him and Michael Ingram, correspondent for Britain's independent TV network, five hours later. Their room and luggage were searched.

Mr. MacFarlane says police raided the Casa Grande Hotel and detained all the guests.

The story says that during the weekend rebels who oppose the regime of President Fulgencio Batista drove through Havana streets tossing home-made incendiary stores and hoses.

N. S. Member Poor Condition OTTAWA (CP) — Angus MacDonald, member of the Parliament for Antigonish-Bourgeois who suffered a minor stroke Jan. 29 following a minor operation, Monday was reported in poor condition.

Hospital authorities said the condition of Mr. MacDonald, elected as a Progressive Conservative in the Nova Scotia constituency last June 10, remained unchanged.

The 56-year-old parliamentarian assistant to Transport Minister George Hees suffered the stroke the night he was to leave hospital following the minor operation. His condition has been reported ever since.
