## Canada Is High Industrially

**WALSALL, England (CP)** — With three-fifths of one per cent of the world's population, Canada has become one of the world's leading industrialized nations, H. Leslie Brown, commercial councillor for Canada, told a meeting of industrialists in this Staffordshire town Thursday.

Addressing the annual luncheon of the Walsall area of the National Union of Manufacturers, Brown outlined Canada's economic prospects. He predicted that her imports from Britain for 1957 will increase to 15 per cent over last year's figures.

## Fails To Save Old Theatre

**LONDON (AP)** — Almost in tears, actress Vivian Leigh admitted defeat Thursday in her effort to save London's St. James Theatre from being demolished to make room for a new office building.

"It is naturally a bitter disappointment," she said, "not only to people in the theatre, but to people all over England and a great deal of the world, judging from letters I received."

She spoke at a luncheon after officials of the Piccadilly and St. James Association said they found it impossible to raise the more than \$50,000 to save the historic theatre.

## Russians Have Developed North

**OTTAWA (CP)** — Russia today would be a far less powerful nation if it had not developed its northern reaches, R. A. J. Phillips, chief of the northern affairs department's Arctic division, said Thursday.

The fact that Canada is one of the world's two major northern powers—owning 1,500,000 square miles of ore-rich northland—is a major fact Canadians must face, Mr. Phillips told the Women's Canadian Club here.

"We own the kind of wealth—only rather more—than which the Soviet Union has attached such importance in its north."

"The difference is that the Russians have developed their north far more and Russia today would be a less powerful nation, economically, politically, militarily if it had not developed its northern resources."

## Average Family Is 3.9 Persons

**OTTAWA (CP)** — The number of Canadian families increased by 424,116 between 1951 and 1956, the bureau of statistics reported Thursday.

The 1956 population census reported 3,711,500 families compared to 3,287,384 in 1951.

Of the total, 91 per cent consisted of a married couple with or without children. The average size of families with both husband and wife at home was 3.9 persons.

Canada's husband and wife teams showed that on the average, a husband was 43 and a wife 39.

## Thorneycroft Says No "Bomb"

**OTTAWA (CP)** — Peter Thorneycroft, chancellor of the United Kingdom exchequer, said Friday he dropped no "bomb" at Mont Tremblant, Que.

He said that when he disclosed there last Saturday that Britain had informally proposed an Anglo-Canadian free-trade union, he was depicted in some reports as a man with "two bombs" in his pockets.

He told a press conference he hoped he would never again be so depicted. He had disclosed the informal proposal in reply to reporters' questions. There had been news reports that such a proposal had been made and he could not deny their truth.
