Cooking Water. One of the secrets of palatable food is knowing how to cook water. The secret is to put fresh filtered water into a clean kettle already warm, to let it boil quickly and to use it the instant it is boiled. It is a combination of lime, iron and drags in the kettle and all the good water evaporated into air.

It is surprising that many householders, especially neat and particular, seem to think that a kettle will stay clean without active measures on their part. The fact is that nothing but water is boiled in it does not guarantee it against the need of scouring. It will soon become coated with a scum-like layer of salts, unless it receives the same care as other cooking utensils. Food cooked with water which is not properly boiled or which is boiled in a kettle coated with drags, has not the same flavor that properly cooked food has. Moreover, it is dangerous to health.

Big Families in Quebec. It was only five years ago that the Province of Quebec passed a law providing that 100 acres of free land should be given to every father of a family who had twelve children living, issue of a lawful marriage, and since then no less than 1,741 fathers of twelve or more children have complied with the conditions of the act and received the State bounty of 100 acres. How the size of families up in Quebec compares with those of Massachusetts may be seen by reference to the last census figures of this State, which make the number of families having twelve or more living children 875, and the population of the Province of Quebec is considerably less than that of Massachusetts. It is quite apparent that the Quebec law is accomplishing its purpose of giving marks of consideration for fruitfulness in the sacred bonds of matrimony.—Boston Herald.

Average Life of Physicians. One of the most curious statistical records that has been compiled in this century is that by Dr. Salzman, of Essling, Wurttemberg, on the average duration of life among physicians. He found, on going over the ancient records of the kingdom, that in the sixteenth century the average duration of life among the class was but 36.5 years; in the seventeenth century, 45.8; in the eighteenth, 48.8; and at the present time they reach the favorable age of 56.7. It appears from the foot notes to the above that this very great increase in longevity is due to the disappearance of the "black pest," the introduction of vaccination and the great diminution in the number of typhus epidemics, three classes of diseases which formerly decimated the medical practitioners.
