## CHOLERA'S RAVAGES

Reports from London, Paris and St. Petersburg.

Another Burglar—Fires Four Shots—A Plucky Wife to the Rescue.

LONDON, Aug. 29.—Chief Engineer Walker, of the steamer Gerous which arrived at Middlesboro yesterday from Hamburg, died of cholera at the Dundee National Hotel.

BERLIN, Aug. 29.—Official records have been posted up announcing the presence of cholera in Amsterdam. A stoker belonging to the steamer Werra from Hamburg, died of cholera to-day.

PARIS, Aug. 29.—Twenty-nine persons suffering with choleraic disorders, were admitted to the hospital yesterday.

ST. PETERSBURG, Aug. 29.—The new cases of cholera on Friday were 207, and the deaths numbered 3334.

LIVERPOOL, August 27.—The steamship companies will not book emigrants from the cholera infected districts.

A previous London dispatch says:—The medical officers and the sanitary and local government boards here are confident that there is nothing to fear in this city. The system of sanitation now in vogue is far different from that in 1866, the period of the last preceding cholera epidemic which afflicted London and which reached New York. Now, cases of cholera are confined entirely to the last end of London and to the worst quarters of that district, and it could be easily stamped out if it exhibited the smallest tendency to spread. The methods of prevention are as nearly perfect and certain as it is possible to make them.

It is not unlikely that an international system of quarantine may result from the latest scare.

## A Plucky Wife.

WOODSTOCK, Ont., Aug. 29.—Today Mr. Ball, a barrister, while in his sitting room was approached by James Kelly of Montreal with a revolver in his hand. Kelly demanded money. Ball clinched the man and a terrible struggle ensued. Ball's wife rushed down stairs and beat the burglar into unconsciousness with an oaken case after he had fired four shots into Ball's body. The wounded man will recover.

## At Their Wits' End.

ST. JOHN, Aug. 28.—St. John seems to be at the mercy of a gang of burglars. Several dwellings have been broken into and ransacked. The police are at their wit's end and desperate citizens are arming themselves with revolvers. The mayor offers \$500 reward for the capture of the robbers. They are believed to be Yankee professionals.

## Lizzie Borden's Trial.

FALL RIVER, Aug. 29.—The only important evidence in the Lizzie Borden trial to-day was the testimony of a witness who said Lizzie told her she went to the barn to get a piece of iron for the window, thus contradicting the lead nicker statement.

## More Rain Coming.

BOSTON, Aug. 29.—There will probably be rain by Tuesday night, stationary followed by slightly higher temperature, easterly winds, becoming variable.

OTTAWA, Aug. 26.—Mr. James Cooper, in Metcalfe village, Tuesday, lost his little girl, aged two, who removed a few boards which covered a pot of lye for making soap, and somehow fell in headfirst. Mrs. Cooper discovered the horror some minutes after she was missed, but life was then extinct. The girl's face showed signs of having suffered a terrible death.

## Romance in Real Life.

HOW A YOUNG SEAVANT GIRL CAPTURED A \$20,000 HUSBAND.

The co. flagration in St. John's has at least brought happiness to one individual, and given her a home that she had never dreamed of. One who was summoned to the distressed city, was James Stod of Seattle, Washington territory, a man of wealth. He went to St. John's to see his people who had suffered by the fire. He was one of the passengers on the Portia, which arrived from that city on Thursday. On the same steamer were a number of young women who went to Halifax to secure places as domestic servants forced to leave home as a result of the fire. Among the number was a Miss Struggles. She became acquainted with Mr. Stod. It was love at first sight. The question of their future life was settled while gazing upon the waves as the steamer was speeding toward Halifax. On arrival here arrangements were completed for the marriage, and in the evening they were joined in holy wedlock by the Rev. Mr. LeMoine.

## Longley's Plea for Freedom of Speech.

TORONTO, Aug. 26.—Hon. J. W. Longley, Attorney General of Nova Scotia, on the "Future of Canada," says the World writes with a legal gentleman's sentence. He does not declare himself, but by reading between the lines it can be easily seen that though he may not have gone all the way Mr. Longley has strong leanings toward annexation. He says that the subject of the future of Canada is one that cannot be shirked. The time for discussion has arrived and what is not wrong for a private citizen cannot be wrong for a paid official. He says he knows no law, civil or moral, to prevent Elgin Myers or any other Canadian from advocating political union with the States and that his position as a sworn official has nothing to do with the case. He characterizes inferentially Sir Oliver Mowat's action in dismissing Myers as "gag law" and that knight as an opponent of free speech. He further states that the premier of any province of Canada has a perfect right to hold annexation views even while holding office. An action condemning significantly freedom of speech, as did Sir Oliver's in the Myers case, is not true patriotism.

## Sprinkled Paris Green.

A PECULIAR CASE OF POISONING OF INTEREST TO THOSE USING PARIS GREEN.

The following despatch from Newburyport, Aug. 23rd to the Boston Herald, will no doubt be interesting to the many who are using Paris Green on their potatoes and may also explain the story that a horse drank a bucketful of the mixture for the potatoes and was no worse for it. The despatch reads:—Newburyport, Aug. 23, 1892. Interest in the Salisbury Beach poisoning case is once more revived and the mysterious deaths are troubling the authorities. People heretofore have been inclined to accept the accident theory, as no sufficient motive was shown for a wholesale destruction of life, but a change has come over public sentiment, and, although the conclusions are unpleasant, that it was intentional is now quite generally believed. Dr. E. P. Hurd, a Newburyport physician of high standing and of an investigating turn of mind, has spent considerable time on this mysterious affair, and in to-day's issue of a local paper gives the result of his inquiries. The discovery of paris green in the livers and kidneys of two of the victims, he says, makes the inference almost irresistible that all who were sick at the Cable House about July 20, or who traced their sickness to a meal eaten at that date, were made sick by paris green. Paris Green owes its toxic properties to the arsenic of copper which it contains. It is the same kind of pigment which was
