

### FOR SOMETHING SPECIAL, TRY A WORKING HOLIDAY.

If you're looking for a vacation with a difference, why not try excavating Stone Age cave sights in Swaziland... running a mobile day camp in the Shetland Islands... building sheepfolds and cowsheds in Italy ... or teaching English to a family in Japan? Those are only a few of the thousands of opportunities listed in the newly-released Working Holidays 1983, the most comprehensive and authoritative guide to short-term work around the world. The 250 page book is published annually by the Central Bureau for Educational Visits and Exchanges in England, and distributed throughout North America by the Canadian Bureau for International Education.

CBIE, a national non-profit educational organization head-quartered in Ottawa, each year prepares a specialized supplement to Working Holidays designed for Canadian and American job-seekers. The book is only available through

mail orders to CBIE, 141 Laurier Ave. West, Ottawa, Ontario, Canada K1P 5J3. Canadian prices are \$7.50 (\$8.90 first class mail) and American orders are \$6.50 U.S. (\$7.50 first class mail) Payments must accompany orders.

In addition to listing thousands of paid work opportunities such as manual labour, farm-work, au pair work, teaching and work in the tourist industry, Working Holidays describes a comparable number of voluntary positions in conservation, archaeology community work and workcamps and tells how to obtain both types of employment. Detailed practical information on work permits and visas, accommodation, medical requirements, passports, customs, identity cards, insurance, useful publications and addresses abroad are also provided. Workcamp organization and housing or information facilities equipped to accommodate blind, deaf, or physically handicapped individuals are also listed. The travel section includes much specific information on air,

countries in Asia, Africa, and the Middle East are also highlighted.

The book annually sells about 60,000 copies in Europe. Said one British reviewer this year, "After reading this book, I decided that a summer holiday lolling on the beach was a waste of time."

**TITLE:** Kissing to be Clever

Culture Club, as the name might imply, is a four piece band containing both black and white members. J. Geils returns with an explosive live album to follow up their multi-platinum records "Love Stinks" and "Freeze Frame". Having survived and prospered through out the late sixties and seventies the Geils Band would be considered the premier American Rock and Roll outfit.

This newest release was recorded last summer during a six concert run at Detroit

Pine Knob Theatre. The band's latest big hits "Centrefold" and "Love Stinks" are included as well as older favorite "Just Can't Stop Me" and "Sanctuary".

**TITLE:** R.S.V.P.

Over the last few years the Kings, a Toronto based band, have received an appreciable amount of airplay complimented with good record sales as a result of the release of their two Bob Ezrin produced albums.

R.S.V.P. is a four song mini-album produced by the band on their own Dizzy Records label. Side two of the record is consistent with the band's previous work and the songs "As if I Cared" and "A Month of Sundays" are already getting airplay.

Side one, on the other hand, contains acoustical guitar, piano, and choir arrangements, something we never heard from this band before.
