Harris Explains Interest Rates

OTTAWA (CP)—Finance Minister Harris said Tuesday he wants to dispel any impression that the Bank of Canada consciously raised interest rates in this country. It was not through action by the central bank that interest rates have risen, he said, but as a result of a greater demand on Canada's money supply. The Bank of Canada rate only reflected interest rates generally. Replying in the Commons to questions from several opposition members, Mr. Harris said it is Bank of Canada policy not to have its interest rate lower than that for short-term borrowings by the federal government from the chartered banks and other financial institutions.
