SCHMIERCASE.

A Creamery Man Who Finds Profit in Making Cottage Cheese.

Schmiercase is the German name for what is known in English as cottage cheese and likewise pot cheese. It got the last name because the sour milk to make it used to be heated in a pot swung over a crane in the good old times. In brief, it is the soft curd cheese made from sour skim milk. It is found in stores where dairy products are sold and is very good indeed when made right and when it has rich new milk and some sweet cream stirred into it. It is a most healthful dish, too, and very good for hot weather, but it is not fit to eat when made from bitter, moldy old milk.

G. B. Lawson tells in The Creamery Journal how to make it at a creamery: In a recent issue of the New York Produce Review I made the statement that if the skim milk was made into cottage cheese it would be more profitable for the creamery man and patron than to feed the skim milk to calves and hogs, and I offered to send a receipt for making it to any buttermaker who wanted it, but I have received so many inquiries concerning it that I have concluded to answer them through the dairy press, so that they all will be answered alike. To show that there is a demand for cottage cheese, I will state that I received a reply from a creamery man who has opened a retail store in Buffalo. He says that he sells five or six barrels some days, and that he makes 700 or 800 pounds at a time, using a 300 gallon tank to scald the milk. So, you see, he makes it on a large scale, but he does not say what price it sold for. It depends on how large a scale you intend making it and how you go about it, but a beginner had better commence on a small quantity, so I will give the recipe for making it on a small scale. Take a ten gallon can of skim milk and let it set until it gets thick and sour. After it reaches that stage set the can in a tank of hot water, turn on your steam and let the water heat until the milk in the can separates the water from the casein, and the lower the temperature the milk will whey off the softer and better will be the curd and the better you heat your milk the drier your curd will be. After the curd and water have separated strain all through a cheese bandage and hang up for 24 hours to drain, but do not press it any. After it has drained dry, moisten it with new milk or sweet cream, so that it will stick together when it is ready to mold into bricks or press into balls and be marketed. Of course you can scald the milk in larger quantities if necessary and strain through a large strainer, but I have found that the cheese bandage makes the most convenient strainer, as it is easily handled and always ready for use.

DRIPY BEEF Creamery.

We exported to Europe last year 21,933,000 pounds of butter.

This is the best season for dairymen to buy milk feed to last them all year. The mills are crammed with wheat and grain and the mill men want to sell the cow feed to get it out of the way. Consequently they will let it go cheap. Muster your ready cash and take it to the mill, and you will get a bargain in feed.

As a rule it is certainly not well for cows to remain in milk all the time. What is gained in one way is lost in another, and the constantly milked cow's yield will not be so great after calving as that of the one which ran dry a month.

In very fine butter there is 80 per cent of pure butter fat. The other 20 per cent is made up of various other solids and salt and water.

Canadian butter rates higher commercially in Europe than ours. The reason is the Canadians have studied carefully the tastes of the European market and suited their butter to it, while we have not.

In summer, where one has worked up the right kind of market, there is considerably more profit in selling cream than butter.

Ripen Cream Just Right.

Holding the temperature down in order to avoid over-ripening destroys that rich, nutty flavor and leaves a somewhat bitterish one. The following is what one of the very finest butter makers in this locality said to me last week when I informed him I was surprised that his butter lacked that richness necessary to grade it as "extra" when the conditions were all so favorable to the making of fancy butter.

Said he: "I have found it extremely difficult this spring to get the proper manipulation of my cream to have it sufficiently ripe for churning when the time comes that it must go into the churn. I have only a single cream vat and must churn the cream in the morning, since I require the room in the vat for that day's skim. This, of course, prevents my holding the cream until it is sufficiently ripe. Consequently at times I have not obtained that rich, nutty flavor you claim is lacking, and I have been aware of the fact to a certain degree, but did not think the results were so noticeable until you made it known. I will now prepare a starter from some whole milk, secured from one of my patrons, whose cows are new milkers, and I guarantee that my goods will be O. K. for flavor next week."

Today I examined this maker's goods and find them ideal, and all due to the fact that he has, for the past week, developed the proper ripeness in his cream. This case tells the whole story, and if the makers will sufficiently ripen their cream this cool weather their butter will be of the very finest, providing always that there is no unclean flavor in the cream caused from improper feeding or unclean milk pipes, pump or churn.—George E. Mansfield in Hoard's Dairyman.
