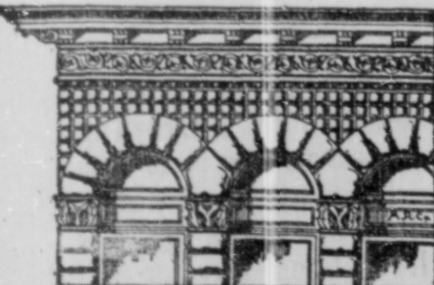

She—Perhaps so with a man, but not with a woman.

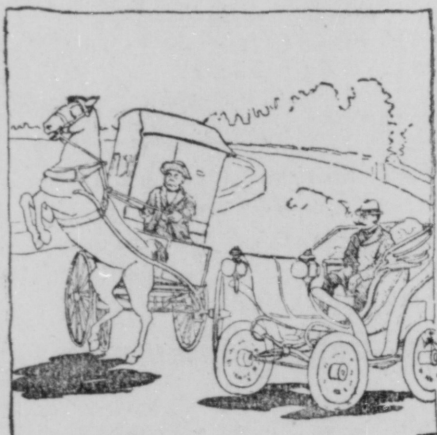
He (at a jeweler's the next day)—I want a diamond ring, lady's size, brightest you have.—New York Weekly.

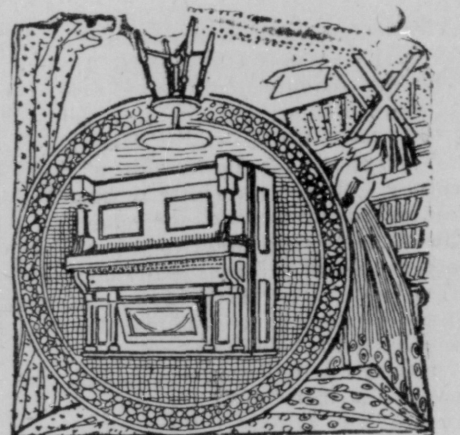

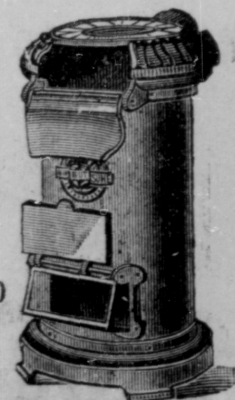
