### Brazil plans to proceed with huge power project

RIO DE JANEIRO (Reuters)—Brazil's vast interior is going ahead with one of the biggest hydroelectric projects in the western world—the Urubupunga on the great Parana River, between the states of Sao Paulo and Mato Grosso.

The total capacity of its two power plants at Jupia, already more than half completed, and Iha Solteira (Spinster Island), where President Humberto Castello Branco inaugurated construction work in April, will be 4,600,000 kilowatts, or about as much as the total output of all other plants now operating in Brazil.

This means that the Urubupunga—an Indian name which literally means "the place of culture droppings"—project is among the four largest of its type in the world. The other three are all in the Soviet Union: Krasnoyarsk, which produces 6,000,000 kilowatts, and Bratsk and Sukhovo-Telva, each with 4,500,000 kilowatts in installed capacity.

Taken alone, the Iha Solteira plant, about 35 miles upstream from Jupia, with an installed capacity of 2,200,000 kilowatts, will be far and away the biggest of its kind in Latin America.

The Urubupunga project, estimated to cost more than \$900,000, will begin serving a seven-state area of south central Brazil, including the industrial concentrations of Sao Paulo, Minas Gerais and Guanabara (Rio de Janeiro City) in the 1970s.

This rich area accounts for some 80 per cent of the present Brazilian demand for light and power.

Apart from its significance in terms of electric power, Urubupunga also will mark another big step towards opening up

should begin commercial production early in 1968. The much larger Iha Solteira plant, with 3,200,000 kilowatts of installed capacity, is scheduled to begin producing in 1973.

### French taught in crash course

ELLIOT LAKE, Ont. (CP)—This summer 154 elementary and secondary school teachers pledged not to speak a word of English for six weeks.

The English-speaking teachers of French took part in an

experimental total-immersion French course at the Centre for Continuing Education in this Northern Ontario community.

None of them is bilingual. But the course, ended in the second week of August, left them more fluent in French and with a wider knowledge of the language and the methods of teaching it.

The course was the continuation of a pilot project developed in London, Ont., last year by David Steinhaur, assistant supervisor of the Ontario education department's teacher education branch.
