Inter-Varsity Christian Fellowship

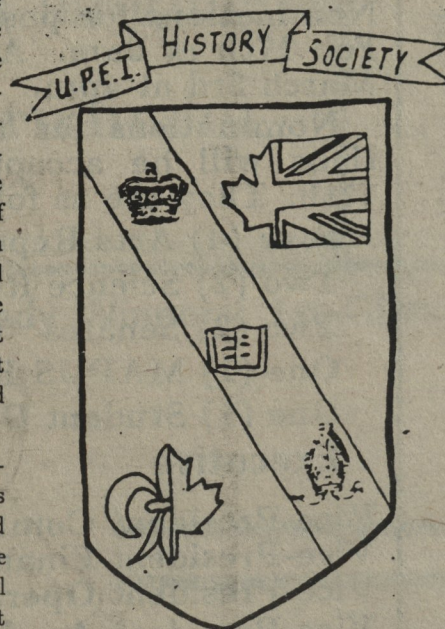
