### Britain Cuts Trade Gap

LONDON (AP)—Britain narrowed its trade gap slightly last month as exports exceeded imports the government board of trade has reported.

The trade deficit - imports compared with exports - continued its downward trend. The figure is a vital index for the stability of the British pound.

Chancellor of the Exchequer James Callaghan has already said that last year's huge trade gap of \$2,000,000,000 would be halved this year if present trends continue. He hopes to put Britain's trade into the black by the end of 1966.

The board of trade reported that exports last month totalled \$1,227,000,000 compared to \$1,164,000,000 in September.

Imports totalled \$1,437,000,000 a slight increase over September's \$1,425,000,000.

That left a trade gap of \$210,000,000 - or \$9,000,000 less than September. With inevitable trade benefits such as shipping, insurance and other profits figured in the deficit for October came to only \$54,000,000.
