**PARLIAMENT OF CANADA.**

**Senator Ferguson has a Keen  
Eye for our Farming  
Interests.**

Reported that Mr. Fred. Peters, Q. C.  
Will be Chief Justice of British  
Columbia.

OTTAWA, March 10.—In the House of Commons, yesterday, the Yukon debate extended past midnight as Sir Wilfrid Laurier refused to adjourn.

Sir Charles Tupper asked the Premier whether the date of West Prince election had been fixed.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier replied that the Government had only heard that the funeral of Mr. Perry had taken place and thought it well to allow some time to elapse.

In the Senate, Hon. Mr. Ferguson called attention to the announcement of the Grand Trunk Railway that the company had decided to charge one-half fare hereafter on pure bred stock, and enquired if a similar concession would be given on the Government railways. Hon. Mr. Ferguson said that the farmers of the Maritime Provinces, in order to enable them to procure the best stock, desired to import from Ontario pure bred animals for breeding purposes. But rates on the railway were so heavy that they could not do so to any extent.

Hon. Senator Scott said that he had called the attention of the Minister of Railways to the matter and would give an answer in a few days.

A despatch from British Columbia suggests Frederick Peters, Q. C., for the vacant Chief Justiceship; but Sir Charles Hubert Tupper, his law partner, gives no credit to the story. It is said that the Minister of Justice is considering whether Mr. D. C. Fraser, M. P. of Guysborough, is eligible for the appointment, he having been recommended by certain British Columbia members.

**PLAGUE RIOT IN BOMBAY**

**Mahommedans vs. Christians.**

**GREAT DISTURBANCE AND SOME  
BLOODSHED.**

**Troops in Charge of the Locality.**

BOMBAY, March 10.—A riot arose here yesterday on account of the Plague party inquiring into the cause of the sickness of Mahommedan women. An enormous crowd of tribesmen gathered and stoned and mobbed the party which retired for an escort of armed police and then returned and demanded the surrender of a patient—which was refused.

A Parsee magistrate who exhorted the populace not to resist the police was himself struck, whereupon he ordered the police to charge. They did so and four Mahommedans were killed and several wounded.

The disturbance spread with alarming rapidity until the whole quarter presented a spectacle similar to that of the mobs of 1893.

The Mahommedans who were joined by the Hindoos assaulted every European or Eurasian they met and a hysterical mob

The residents barricaded themselves in their houses and fired on the cartridges from their windows. Meanwhile, troops were hurried to the scene and a battery of artillery is now patrolling the locality.

The outbreak was specially directed against the Christians.

It is reported that two European soldiers were nearly killed. It is difficult, owing to the excitement, to obtain details of the outbreak.

PEKIN, March 7.—Much uneasiness is felt in Chinese circles in consequence of the Russian demands. The Russian minister of finance, moreover, is reported to have urged these demands peremptorily and to have complained that the Chinese loan was settled in spite of the disapproval of Russia. All kinds of speculators are flocking here for the purpose of securing concessions for electric lighting for the street railroads and regular railroads, etc. The Chinese merchants are showing great eagerness to participate in the enterprises.
