**Montague Church Annual Meeting**

**Tribute To New Island Senator**

The following tribute to Senator Inman of this Province appeared as a feature in the "Ottawa Scene" series in the Toronto Globe and Mail:

"Setting out on yet another phase of an already interesting life is Canada's newest woman Senator, Mrs. Florence Elsie Inman of Montague. For the present she will stay with her eldest son, W. Robert Inman, who is a chemist in the department of mines and technical surveys, and his Irish wife.

Although widely known in the Maritimes, Senator Inman is very well known among Canadian generally, but those who have met her are her keen fans and none of them keener than her Irish daughter-in-law. "She's a wonderful person. She's just terrific", she

says of her husband's mother in a warm tone that implies even a Senatorship was nothing more than she deserved.

"Others who knew her are equally enthusiastic. "She has that air of culture and refinement that is the stamp of a real Maritimer", one said, adding that though she was not physically large, she always stood out in any group of women. Another spoke of her being usually pleasant-looking, and another that she was sweet and gentle along with all this with a flair for organization and a head for business. Senator Inman is now the successful operator of a hotel at Montague, and is president of the Innkeepers Association, but success in business has not dried up her natural interest in public affairs.

"In the war years she held top post with the Red Cross and the I.O.D.E., and afterward was provincial president of the Women's Auxiliary of the Canadian Legion. When the Island's Liberal women's association was first formed she became its president and remained so until her recent appointment of the Senate. When as provincial president she came to Ottawa to attend meetings of the National Liberal Federation, her opinions received serious consideration.

"The widow of a Judge, Senator Inman has four sons; besides Robert in Ottawa, there are Dr. George Wilfred with the navy and now in St. John's, Newfoundland; and Maj or Victor of the Canadian Army at present on a course in Indianapolis. All the sons are married and there are eight grandchildren."
