Well, university is well on its way for another semester and everyone has their books for all the courses they are taking. Students who wanted to get rid of some used books or buy second hand books would be familiar with the book exchange. The book exchange was held at the Chaplaincy Centre from September 12 to 22 between the hours of 9 and 4. It was set up during second semester last year by Theresa Doyle, a Senior, and Pat Turnbull, a Junior, to provide a method by which students could buy or sell their books. This year the exchange was operated by Pat Turnbull, now a Senior, and Cheryl Parsons, a Sophomore. They raised a

total of \$210, which was divided up between them for all their efforts. Pat said the exchange was a lot more popular this year than last due to the advertising it received. She said many Freshmen knew about the exchange and this will be a good help because they will be around for a few more years. The idea was tried about five years ago but through lack of publicity, it fell through. She said students would sometimes come in looking for a book, find someone with the book they wanted and trade. When asked what changes she would like to see made in the future, she said she would like to see the ten percent commission dropped off the books which was mandatory this year. She would also like

to see the Student Union run the exchange by hiring two people to work instead of volunteer students.

Book exchanges have become a part of most
