

Separation Of Students Seen Education Move

WINNIPEG (CP) — A trend toward separation of students into "ability groups" and improved quality of teaching was predicted Wednesday by Dr. H. H. Saunderson, president of the University of Manitoba.

A program designed for slightly below-average students wasted time and gave above-average students no opportunity to develop as they should, he told the convention of the Canadian Education Association.

He also said he believed there will be a return to the system of competitive marks and grades, now opposed by some educationists who suggested the system has adverse effects on the personality of students.

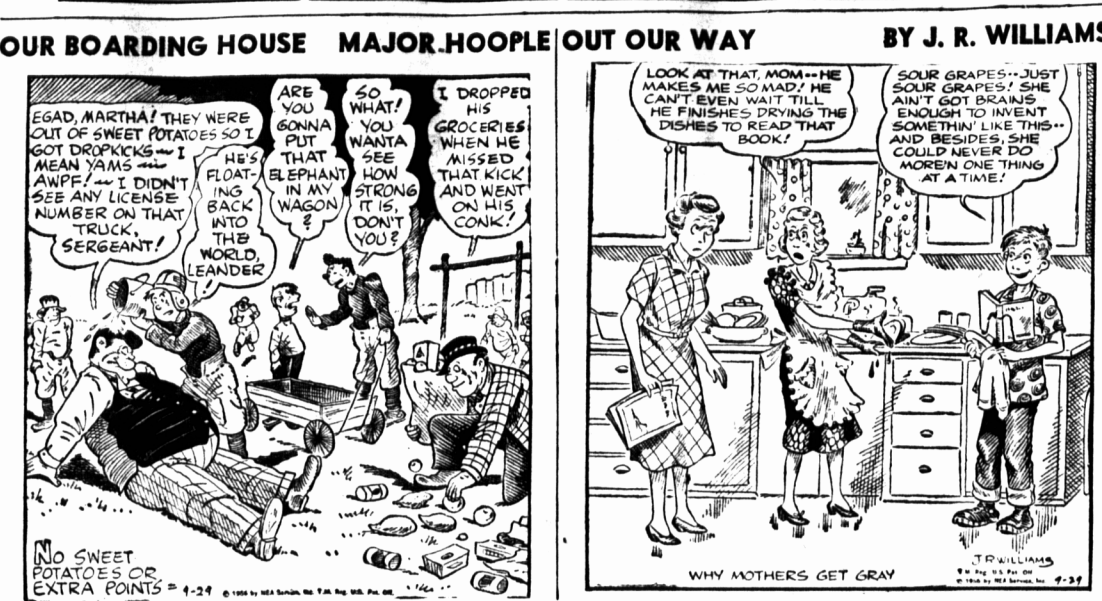

CONTRACT BRIDGE

South dealer. East-West vulnerable.

The bidding:
South West North East
1♣ Pass 1♠ Pass
3NT

Opening lead—jack of diamond.

Many players, with South's hand, would open the bidding with two notrump. It may appear to some that this would violate the requirements for the standard opening two notrump bid, which requires 22 to 24 high card points, but no serious objection can be lodged against the bid.

Aside from the 21 high card points, due weight must be given to the excellent five card club suit which looks as though it is probably good for five tricks as a starter. Blind evaluation based simply on high cards is decidedly unrealistic, if a true appraisal of a hand is to be made. The overall texture, the feel of a hand, are intangible factors which must be respected.

There is no quarrel intended, we should add, with South's choice of one club as the opening salvo. There are many occasions where a player has available to him a choice of two bids, either of which is correct, or, at least, acceptable. Various factors, such as vulnerability, the partnership, lineups, psychological criteria, etc., have their influence upon the ultimate choice.

It is no great feat to produce nine tricks at the notrump contract. One fundamental protective measure must be taken. The attack on South's weakest suit having commenced, a plan must be fabricated to obtain four club tricks without permitting East to take the lead and threaten declarer's remaining diamond honor.

Obviously, if the declarer takes the diamond lead and cashes the A-K-Q of clubs and leads another club to establish his ninth trick, he runs his head into a noose. East returns a diamond and it's curtains.

Fastened, South wins the first diamond, crosses to dummy with a spade, and leads a low club. When East follows low, declarer plays the eight. This loses to the ten, but South acquires his ninth trick, and he is immune to diamond attack.

The method of play suggested assures the contract whenever the clubs break 3-3 or 4-2. The detour around East, where trouble is brewing and the red light flashing, puts South on the right road.

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP)—Mrs. Patricia Nixon pinch-hit for her throat-weary husband at a political rally here Tuesday.

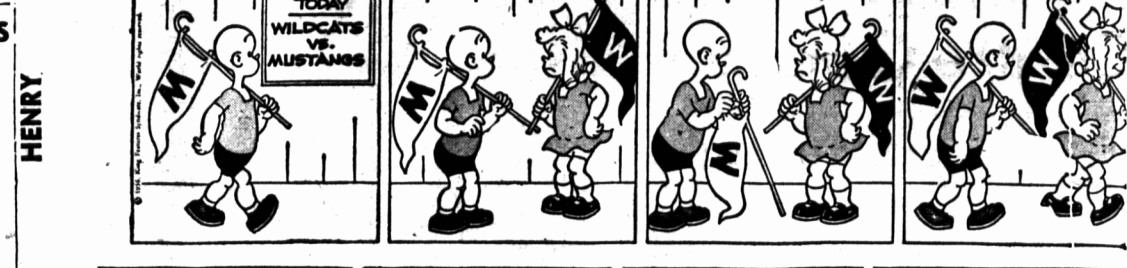
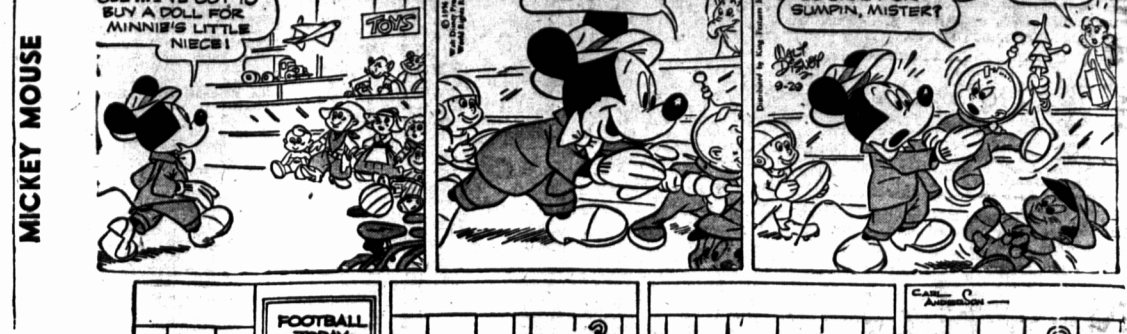
