

Major Reorganization Of Dosco Groups Announced

MONTREAL (CP)—The 23 individual companies of Dominion Steel and Coal Corporation have been grouped into four basic operating divisions in a major reorganization announced today.

Crawford Gordon, president of Dosco Ltd., which controls Dosco, the four divisions are: mining, steel production, steel fabrication and manufacturing and transportation.

Mr. Gordon said the reorganization places the varied Dosco operations "in a logical product relationship to each other."

Besides producing basic steel from mining of coal, Dosco turns out a variety of products from rivets and railway cars in east-Canada plants.

PRESIDENT YET

Mr. Gordon purchased controlling interest in Dosco last November. A. C. MacDonald, Roe's executive vice-president for industrial operations, has acted as chairman of the Dosco management committee. A new Dosco president has not yet been named.

Six companies will form the steel production division: Acadia Steel Co., Stellarton, N.S.; the steel operations of Cumberland Railway and Coal Co., Springdale, N.S.; Dominion Coal Co., Sydney, N.S.; Dominion Limestone, Agassiz, Nfld.; Dominion Wabana Ore, Bell Island.

Nfld.; and Old Sydney Collieries, Sydney Mines, N.S.

The steel production division includes two companies: Dominion Iron and Steel and Seaboard Power Corp., both of Sydney.

The steel fabrication and manufacturing division takes in 11 companies: Halifax Shipyards, Halifax; James Pender and Co., Saint John, N.B.; the Stowell Screw Company, Longueuil, Que.; Graham Nail and Wire Products, Toronto; Aluminum Industries and Canadian Tube and Steel Products, Montreal; Eastern Car Co., Trenton Industries, and Trenton Steel Works, Trenton, N.S.; Canadian Bridge Co., and Trucon Steel Co., Walkerville, Ont.

Four companies are included in the new transportation division: Dominion Shipping Co. and Sydney and Louisburg, and Sydney; the Essex Terminal Railway, Walkerville; and the railway operations of the Cumberland Railway and Col Co., Springhill. This division will also be responsible for dock and coal stockpiling facilities.

Harvey R. Smith, 45, a native of Calgary, becomes vice-president and general manager of the steel fabrication and manufacturing division. He was formerly vice-president, manufacturing, of Avro Aircraft Ltd., another A. V. Roe subsidiary at Malton, Ont.

R. H. Metcalfe, a former vice-president of Massey-Harris-Ferguson, becomes controller of Dosco.

C. R. Snell, former CNR general purchasing agent, will be Dosco's new vice-president in charge of purchasing.

Rand H. Matheson is appointed general traffic manager. He was executive manager of the Maritime Transportation Commission before joining Dosco in 1955.

COMPANY SOLICITOR

R. E. Cromwell, Q.C., who has been solicitor and secretary of Canadian Car Company, Montreal, was appointed general solicitor for Dosco.

C. Arnold Patterson, a native of Dartmouth, N.S., and public relations officer for the Atlantic Provinces Economic Council, becomes Dosco manager of public relations.

A. T. Bonnell, who started as a mail carrier in Dosco's steel plant at Sydney in 1938 and worked up to chief accountant of Dominion Wabana Ore, Ltd., becomes supervisor of inventories for Dosco.

PERSONNEL APPOINTMENTS

Mr. Gordon announced eight personnel appointments, effective Feb. 1.

G. C. Broadbent, who began his career with Dosco as an office boy 42 years ago, becomes vice-president and secretary.

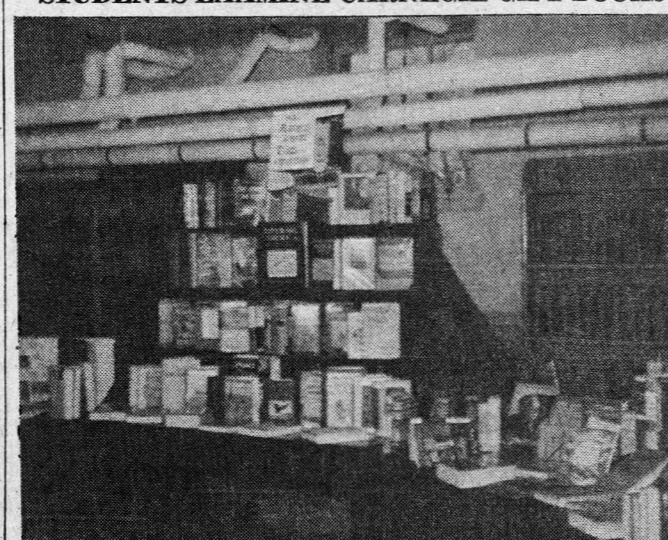

Students At S. D. U. Enjoy Exhibition Of American Books

During the past week large numbers of students at Saint Dunstan's University have been visiting the College library, and often staying much longer than usual. The mysterious object luring the "Saints" across the campus is a very attractive arrangement of three hundred and fifty brightly-jacketed new books, now displayed for the first time in Prince Edward Island.

It was through the efforts of the University librarian, Frances MacMillan, that these books were obtained from the P.E.I. Regional Library for display at St. Dunstan's under the title "An American Panorama."

"These books," explains Miss MacMillan, "were given to the Regional Library by the Carnegie Corporation of New York. Similar gifts have been given by the Corporation to many other libraries in the Commonwealth countries."

Carefully selected to portray contemporary American life, and to explain its origins, the display includes everything from psychiatry and politics to architecture, ballet and jazz.

Poetry by Emily Dickinson and by Robert Frost is included, as well as short stories by Hemingway, Irving, and Poe. Among the plays are "The Glass Menagerie", "Streetcar Named Desire", and "Teahouse of the August Moon", while the novels include "Little Women", "Gone With the Wind", "The Grapes of Wrath", "Uncle Tom's Cabin", "Snow Boat", and "Look Homeward Angel."

There is in the collection something to please every taste, and students and faculty members find the display very interesting.

"There are so many of these books I'd like to read," remarked one student, voicing the general opinion, "I wish I could skip classes and spend the next week in the library."

This display is especially appreciated in view of the fact that next year for the first time, a course in contemporary American literature will be offered at St. Dunstan's.

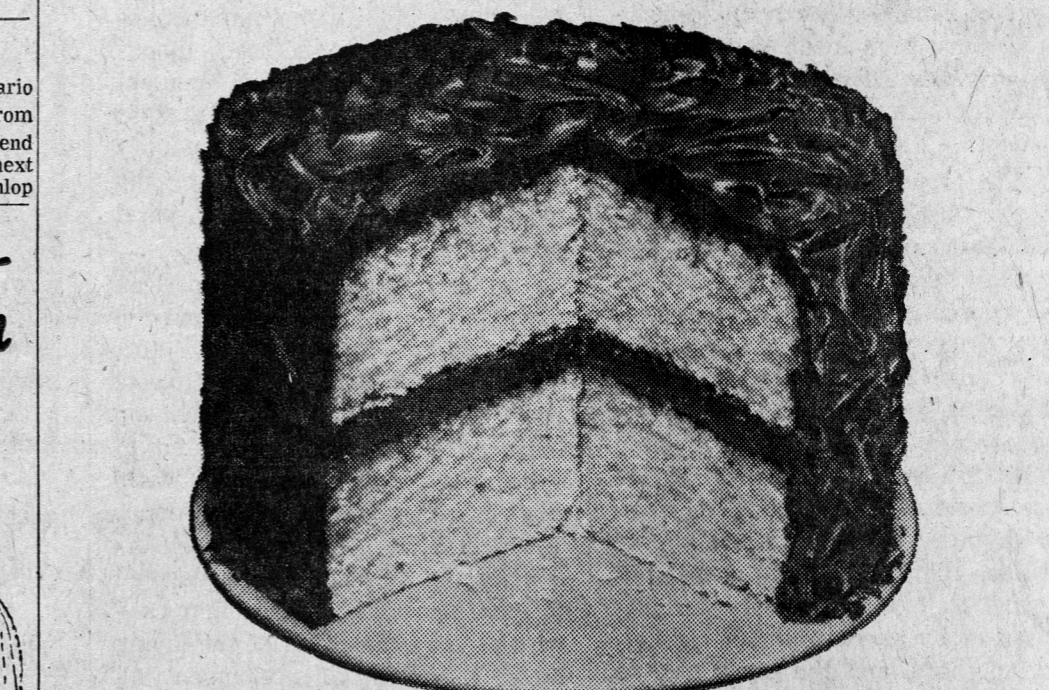
