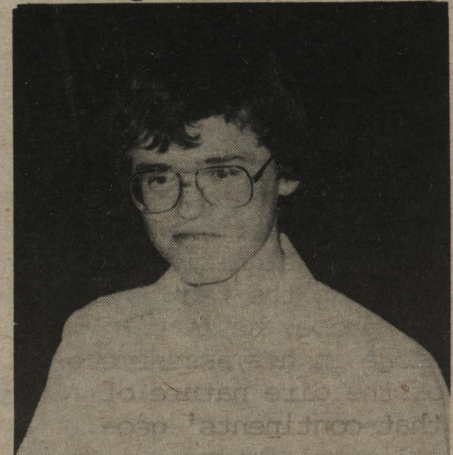
I am taking an arts program. The courses are basically all easy but studying, of course, is required.

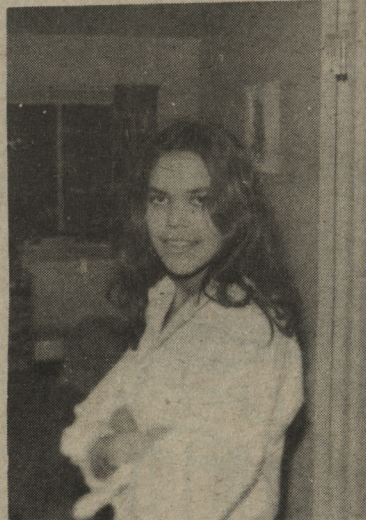
U.P.E.I. is fantastic in that it is small. You get to know your profs, the people in your classes, and if you live in residence, your neighbours.
