PROVINCIAL EXHIBITION NOTES

Preparations for the Provincial Exhibition at Halifax are being rapidly pushed forward. Carpenters are now relaying the floor in the Main Building, and the laying out of space for manufacturers will be commenced, immediately on the completion of the work.

The Commission have about completed arrangements for the appearance at the Exhibition of the magnificently equipped Company of Canadian Dragoons, stationed at Toronto, whose "Musical Ride" has formed one of the biggest drawing cards in years past at the big fairs in the west. The Company numbering sixteen men are part of the Canadian force of Regulars. Wherever they have performed, they have been the admiration of all. Mounted on beautiful and shapely horses, the pick of Canadian stables, they go through their evolutions with all the precision of men who spend their lives in the saddle.

The managers of the great spectacular drama, "The Siege of Sebastopol," which was the central attraction at the Provincial Exhibition last year, freely acknowledged that they were able to make a more brilliant success of it in Halifax than in any other city in the Dominion, because of the availability of trained military men who gave an air of reality to the show, which it could not otherwise have. This manifest advantage will also give greater interest to the representation of the thrilling military drama, "The Relief of Lucknow," which will be given this year. It will be the most unparalleled and magnificent spectacle ever shown in the Maritime Provinces.

At the rate applications for space are pouring into the Secretary's office, the Main Building and the Transportation building, ample as they are in proportions, will be taxed their utmost capacity to accommodate the army of intending exhibitors. The interest in the exhibition is widespread and is attracting the attention of manufacturers, inventors, and specialists, in all parts of the Maritime and Upper Provinces.


