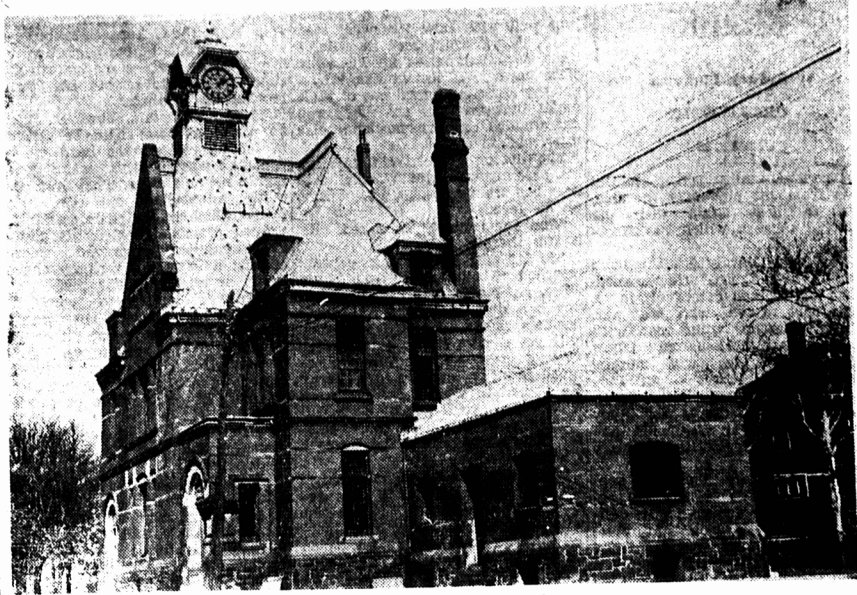

IN MEMORIAM

PETER P. McDONALD

There passed peacefully away after a short illness, in the Prince County Hospital on March 26th, Peter McDonald of Kensington, in his 66th year.

When the First World War broke out Peter was one of the first to enlist in the 105th infantry and proceeded to France where he went through some of the heaviest battles of that grim conflict until he was severely wounded. After spending a long time in hospital he returned home, still carrying fragments of shrapnel which could not be removed.

When World War II broke out, he again enlisted and served with the Home Defense Army for several years.

In the interval he operated a threshing and wood sawing outfit and in this way he became widely known. Of a jovial disposition he was popular with young and old who came in large numbers to pay their last respects.

His largely attended funeral was held on Friday, March 26th, from his home to the Church of the Holy Family, Kensington, where a High Mass of Requiem was sung by his pastor, Rev. Dr. Louis Callaghan, who also performed the service at the grave.

His flag draped coffin was followed by a large number of his comrades in arms who took part in the military service, including the impressive sounding of the last

"SCARAMOUCHE" FAST ACTION DRAMA CAPITOL, SUMMERSIDE

"Scaramouche, Rafael Sabatini's swashbuckling novel of an 18th century swordsman and mountebank who fights and 'acts' his way through love and adventure, has been brought to the Capitol screen in a lavish, spectacular and star-studded Technicolor production by the M-G-M studios.
