## Alberton Fire Brigade Controls House Fire

ALBERTON—The Alberton fire brigade was called out yesterday afternoon to help control a fire at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Amos Ramsay, Alberton South. A blaze in the vicinity of the stove pipe caused considerable damage to the kitchen ceiling and one wall. Neighbours who first noticed the blaze managed to keep it under control until the fire brigade arrived. Contents of the home were in a very upset and soiled condition from smoke and water but kind neighbours set to work and in less than two hours the house which appeared unfit to live in for some days was restored to order and cleanliness. The Red Cross disaster service was also on hand to render assistance. The house is occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Ramsay and a family of 12 children ranging in age from one to 19 years.

HALIFAX (CP) — The weather office says light westerly winds continued to feed very warm, moist air into the Maritimes Tuesday. Fog forming during the night is expected to burn off during the morning and another hot, humid day is forecast for all regions.

New Glasgow, Goshen, Charlottetown 60 and 85, Yarmouth 52 and 75, Sydney 57 and 85, Moncton and Fredericton 60 and 90.

Upper St. John River Valley, Bay of Chaleur: Variable cloudiness; risk of a thunderstorm this evening; very warm; light winds. Low-high at Edmundston and Campbellton 60 and 90.  
Bay of Fundy: Southwest winds 15, extensive fog; visibility near zero, improving occasionally to four miles in mist this morning; warm and humid.
