## Suspect Arraigned On Break At Catholic Welfare Bureau

What is termed by city police as the meanest theft to take place in Charlottetown in several years occurred Monday night at the Catholic Social Welfare Bureau, Pownall Street.

As a result, Harry Melvin Hearty, Charlottetown, appeared before Magistrate A.J. Haslam in city police court yesterday charged with a break, entry and the theft of money over \$50.

**GIVEN REMAND**  
Given the option, the accused elected trial by a judge without a jury. In order to give Hearty time to obtain the services of counsel, the accused was remanded without bail until April 17.

A report by the city police revealed that the break and entry occurred shortly after 9 p.m. Monday and the accused was arrested at the Charlottetown Armouries shortly after 10 p.m. Entry into the building was made by removing a storm window at the rear of the building. A pane of glass was then

broken in the inner sash, enabling the intruder to release the catch and get inside.

Inside the building, the thief ransacked the office and removed approximately \$65 from a desk drawer. While at work, he was reported to have been interrupted by one of the Sisters, who was able to provide the police with an accurate description of the intruder.

**CRASHED OUT WINDOW**  
On being discovered, the thief is said to have headed for the rear of the building, and flung himself through the rear window. He had carefully closed it after getting inside.

On the charge of being drunk and disorderly, Charles Stanley Gallant, Charlottetown, was further remanded for sentence until April 11, in order to permit counsel, Lester O'Donnell, time to arrange bond.

Of the seven drunk and incapable on the docket, four were each sentenced to 30 days in Queens County Jail and another was given a 20 day suspended sentence. Another was fined \$20 and costs or 10 days and the seventh was placed in Riverside Hospital.

Pleading guilty to failing to stop at a "stop" sign another was sentenced to \$5 and costs or two days.

## British High Commissioner Will Address Canadian Club

Rt. Hon. Viscount Amory, GCMG, British High Commissioner to Canada, will speak at a special meeting of the Charlottetown Canadian Club Saturday evening at the Charlottetown Hotel.

Viscount Amory, who will visit the city as part of a tour of the Maritimes, will talk on "The Commonwealth".

The High Commissioner will arrive Friday, spend the weekend here and leave Monday for Fredericton, N.B.

Lord Amory was appointed to his present post in the autumn of 1961 following a two-year term as Chancellor of the Exchequer. Previously he held positions as minister of pensions, minister of state, board of trade minister of agriculture and fisheries and minister of agriculture and fisheries and food.

A chairman of the council of ministers of the organization for European co-operation he attended meetings in Paris, and as Chancellor of the Exchequer he attended the Commonwealth economic conference in Montreal in September, 1958. Later he went to New Delhi for meetings of the International Bank and of the International Monetary fund.

He has held directorships with Lloyd's Bank and with Imperial Chemical Industries a member of others. For many years he has been England's chief M.O.S. Scout commissioner.

He has visited Canada on a number of previous occasions. His appointment was announced Tuesday.
