PARLIAMENT OF CANADA.

Fast Atlantic Steamship Service

Date of Prorogation Still in Doubt.

OTTAWA, June 15.—Sir Richard Cartwright yesterday afternoon moved approval of the Fast Line Steamship contract. He said that the proposed vessels will be ten thousand tons; speed, 21 knots, and of the Campania type. The only question of doubt that had arisen he said was as to the capacity of Messrs. Peterson & Tait to carry out the contract. On this point the Government had satisfied itself. Sir Charles Tupper regretted that the ships were to be turret ships. He knew of no fast passenger line that had turret ships. Mr. Wood, of Hamilton, a government supporter, spoke against the whole Fast Atlantic Steamship scheme.

Sir Richard Cartwright stated in answer to a question that it was not the intention of the Government to create a railway commission.

Prorogation is not now expected before Thursday of next week, and the chances are it will not take place until the end of the month. Sir Richard Cartwright has proposed another lot of supplementary estimates on Wednesday.

SUICIDE OF A DIAMOND KING.

Barney Barnato Leaps into the Sea

LONDON, June 15.—A despatch from Funchal, island Madeira, off the west coast of Morocco, says that on the arrival there of the British steamship Scot, which left Table Bay, Cape Town, on June 2nd for Southampton, it was announced that Barney Barnato, the South African diamond king, who was among the passengers, had committed suicide by leaping overboard. His body was recovered.

A Straight Denial.

MONTREAL, June 15.—C. M. Hayee, general manager of the Grand Trunk Railway, in an interview, yesterday, denied that the Grand Trunk had any intention of operating the Intercolonial.

Cricket at Cambridge.

CAMBRIDGE, June 15.—At the close of the play yesterday the Cambridge men had 260 runs to their credit for three wickets down, playing against the Philadelphia cricketers.

P. E. Island Fish Report.

GEN. WEYLER MUST GO.

Campos Will Not Agree to a Continuation of His Policy.

A despatch to the New York Herald from Havana says: "It is believed here, now that the long suppressed news of affairs in Madrid has been made public, that General Weyler's return to Spain will be the most important result of Canovas' success in retaining power. Private telegrams have been sent to persons here in which it was distinctly stated that Campos, Dominguez and Pidal had given their support to Canovas only with the plain stipulation that General Weyler should go. In fact, it is felt here that Campos, who is now in power in Spain and fills the popular eye, would not on any account lend himself to the continuation of General Weyler's policy. The plan is to send General Larin here from Porto Rico and then supplant him in turn by General Blanceo or Campos. The private telegrams seem to leave no doubt as to General Weyler's coming retirement, and big as is the responsibility for changing captains at so critical a point, it appears to be settled. The first duty of Weyler's successor, when he comes, will be to allow the starving reconcentrados to go at once into the fertile fields and cultivate there the means of life which are denied them inside the ditches and forts. Just previous to General Weyler's return to Havana he countermanded some of Gomez's forces near San-ti Spiritus, under command of Gomez himself, and was forced to retreat, leaving fifty head on the field and one hundred prisoners in the hands of the rebels.
