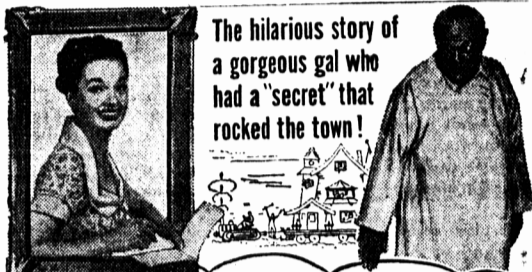

In placing the diamond ace with East because of that player's final double — after all, West made quite a few bids — South still should not have overlooked an excellent avenue to success. After discarding a heart on the spade ace and then leading only one round of trumps, it could cost South nothing to cash the heart king and heart ace, then to ruff a third round of hearts. With this suit breaking 3-3, dummy's fourth heart would be established, and it would not matter who had the diamond ace.
