N. Y. STOCKS

NEW YORK (AP) - Egypt's seizure of the Suez Canal sent oil shares down sharply Friday and other issues declined also as the stock market snapped off its string of six straight daily advances.

Steels interrupted their steady rise to take a setback which was softened, however, by news of the long-awaited settlement of the steel strike.

Rails, motors and other divisions also retreated, but the utilities, by the narrowest of margins, came up a notch on average to reach another record high.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks declined 90 cents to \$189.20, the falls off \$1.10 and the utilities up 10 cents.

Canadian issues on the New York exchange all hit the down side. McIntyre led the losers with a drop of 1 1/2. International Nickel lost 1 1/2. Aluminum Ltd. and Walker-Goodenham 1/2. Other issues lost fractionally.

Montreal Stocks

MONTREAL (CP) - Industrials were irregularly lower at the close of moderate trading, on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges Friday. Price changes were mainly narrow although a point range in both directions.

Steels were easier as Algoma lost two points while Dosco and Sleto slipped fractions. Base metals were hardest hit as International Nickel dropped two points. Sun Bay lost 1 1/2 and Aluminum faded a point. Placer advanced one point in the group.

Refining oils were ahead as McColl gained 1 1/2 and International Petroleum climbed 1 1/4. Shavlinium dipped 1/2 and Bell Telephone eased 1/2 in an easier utilities list. Papers were mixed with Abitibi down and Brown ahead 1/2.

In the banks Montreal and Royal lost major fractions, trading ex-dividends.

Fluctuations were confined to a 15-cent range as the mines and western oils moved to lower ground. Montgomery, Tache, New Jack Lake and El Pen Rey were down while Haitian and Hudson-Ramf were among the few gainers.

The stock exchange's closing average shows banks up 0.16 at 57.85, utilities up 0.1 at a new high of 145.4. Industrials off 0.4 at 322.5, combined off 0.3 at 263.4, papers off 0.30 at 168.15 and golds off 1.01 at 84.26.

Toronto Stocks

TORONTO (CP) - Industrials suffered their biggest loss in a single session since President Eisenhower's abdominal illness last June 8 today as the stock market reversed its trend in mid-session to close lower.

The market was unaffected by the announcement that the United States' steel strike had been settled.

Base metals, which were 1 1/2 points lower an hour before the close, gained some strength in a last-minute rally but closed on the downside. Western oils overcame a lower trend to end mixed to slightly higher.

Just as it had led senior base metals higher Thursday, Hudson Bay today pulled the group lower with a loss of 1 1/2 points to close at 95 1/2. International Nickel dipped a point. Cassiar lost 20 cents. Juniors and Belcher 10 cents.

Canadian Atlantic Central, Le Duc, Del Rio and Vico lost 20-30 cents among western oils. United Oils and Canadian Devonian were down 15 cents. El Pen-Reg, most active stock on the board, trading 513,880 shares, lost 13 cents. Canadian Export Gas gained 15 cents and Husky and Great Plains 1/2 point each.
